




Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees



Highlights

- On 22 April 2013, AFAD - Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey announced that the total number of Syrians registered and accommodated in 17 camps in 8 provinces is 191,541 including 302 Syrians under medical treatment in the hospitals.
- AFAD reported that during the last 24hrs of 21-22 April 2013, there were more returns (369 persons) than new arrivals (159 persons) while in Gaziantep the number of non-camp Syrians registered by AFAD Coordination Center increased to almost 20,000 refugees and over 33,000 Syrians have been given appointments to be registered in the next few months. This brings the total number of Syrians in Turkey to more than 300,000. The Coordination Center officials informed UNHCR that they had stopped to issue new registration appointments but will continue to register all approaching on a daily basis.
- In order to cope with the shortage of capacity in the camps, and to increase the overall capacity of the camps, local authorities informed that another camp is being considered in Sanliurfa province. The fourth camp in Sanliurfa province would be established between Ceylanpinar and Viransehir. There are also several other camps either decided (i.e.: Mardin, Mersin, and Aksaray) or some even about to be completed soon (Kilis/Elbeyli, Osmaniye/Duzici and Malatya). Reportedly some of the very vulnerable Syrians living in urban areas will be given the opportunity to be placed in some of these camps.
- During the visits to the camps, UNHCR Field Teams are informed by the camp authorities that several Syrians approached the officials and requested to be registered to attend the Turkish Language classes provided by Language Course - TOMER because there is an increasing demand from the Syrians to be able to continue their University education. The camp officials are registering the names and relaying to relevant officials for action to be taken.
- During the current reporting period, IOM finalized plans to distribute NFIs to Syrian refugees in camps through the Turkish Red Crescent (Kizilay). The distribution took place between 20 and 22 April. 12,606 items (1,050 mattresses, 6,500 pillows, 3,500 blankets and 1,556 bed sheets) were provided to Kizilay for distribution. Items were identified in close cooperation with Kizilay and based on the needs of new arrivals in the camps. NFIs were provided to the following camps : Adiyaman, kahramanmaras, Nizip 2, Akcakale,
