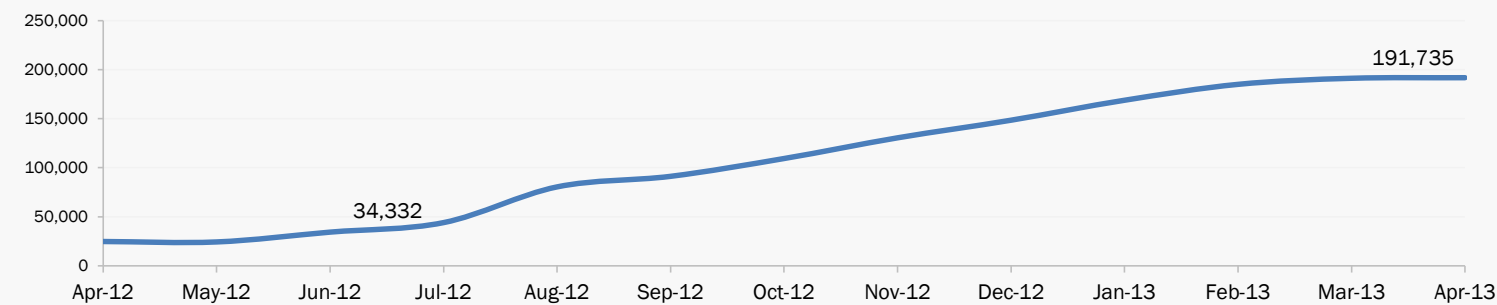
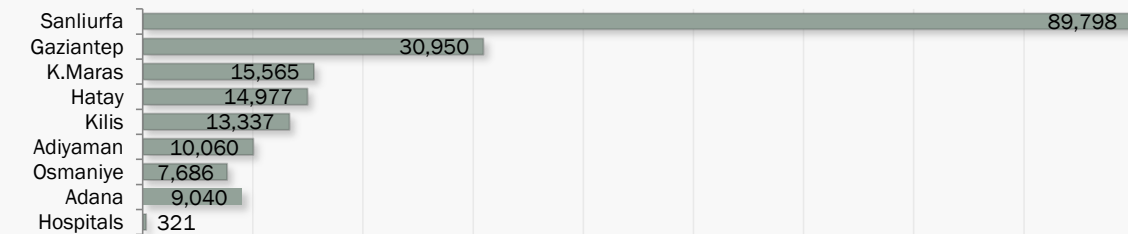


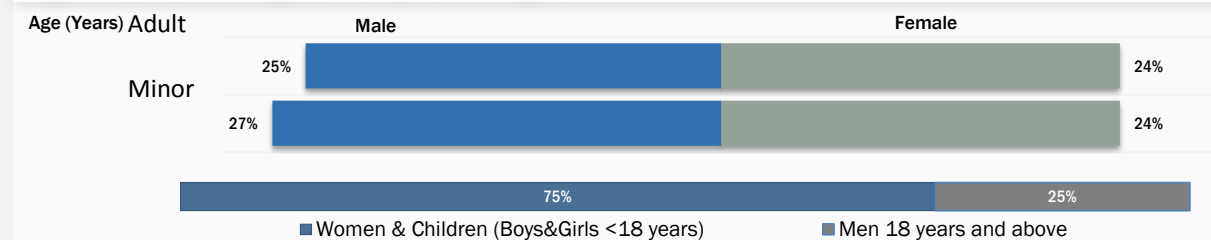

Highlights

- On 25 April 2013, AFAD - Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey announced that the total number of Syrians registered and accommodated in 17 camps in 8 provinces is 191,734 including 321 Syrians under medical treatment in the hospitals.
- It was reported by AFAD, that the number of new arrival Syrians was 400 persons during the 24 hrs. of 24-25 April while the total number of Syrians voluntarily returned during the same period was 217 persons. This brings the total number of new arrivals registered and accommodated in the camps since 1 January 2013 to 55,334 and the number of those who voluntarily returned to Syria to 26,845 people.
- According to local authorities, the situation across the borders is very difficult as several thousands of Syrians are living in very difficult conditions either in IDP camps or public buildings. Reportedly Government of Turkey is providing humanitarian assistance to the people across the border through Turkish Red Crescent. Several local NGOs and self initiative community unions are also organizing humanitarian assistance and delivering across the border to the Syrians.
- Local authorities informed that the registration/enumeration of the non-Camp Syrians is ongoing. The Coordination Center in Gaziantep has become a model for other provinces and the one in Sanliurfa will be operational soon. UNHCR also provided funding through AFAD to establish mobile units to register the non-Camp Syrians.
- UNHCR Field Teams presence in the camps is very much appreciated by the local officials and the camp officials are working in close cooperation with UNHCR Field Teams seeking advice on protection issues, registration and when needed on family reunification cases. UNHCR Field Teams also continue to be present during many of the voluntary return interviews conducted by the camp officials.
- It was reported by the local authorities that despite all efforts, unfortunately the second child who was severely wounded in the tent fire in Ceylanpinar passed away. The camp officials are doing all to provide support to the family who lost their two children and 4 who are still in the hospital. AFAD indicated the UNHCR procured tents will be distributed in Ceylanpinar and Akcakale as these new tents are fire resistant, which will improve safety and shelter.
