

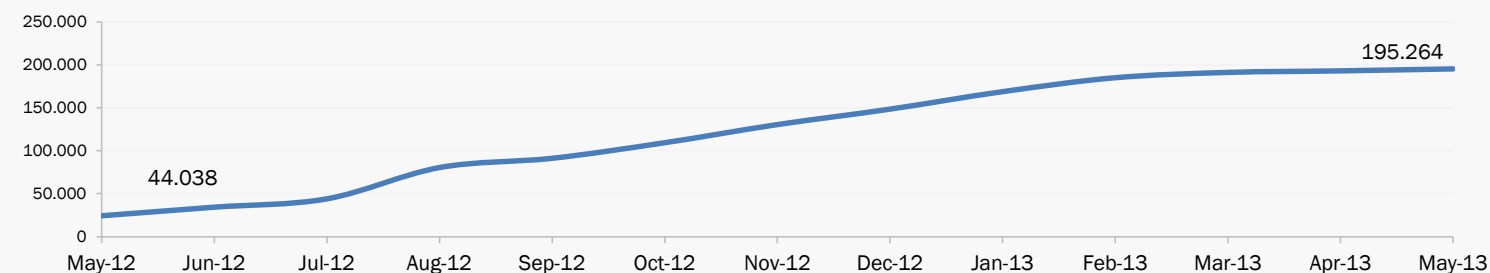

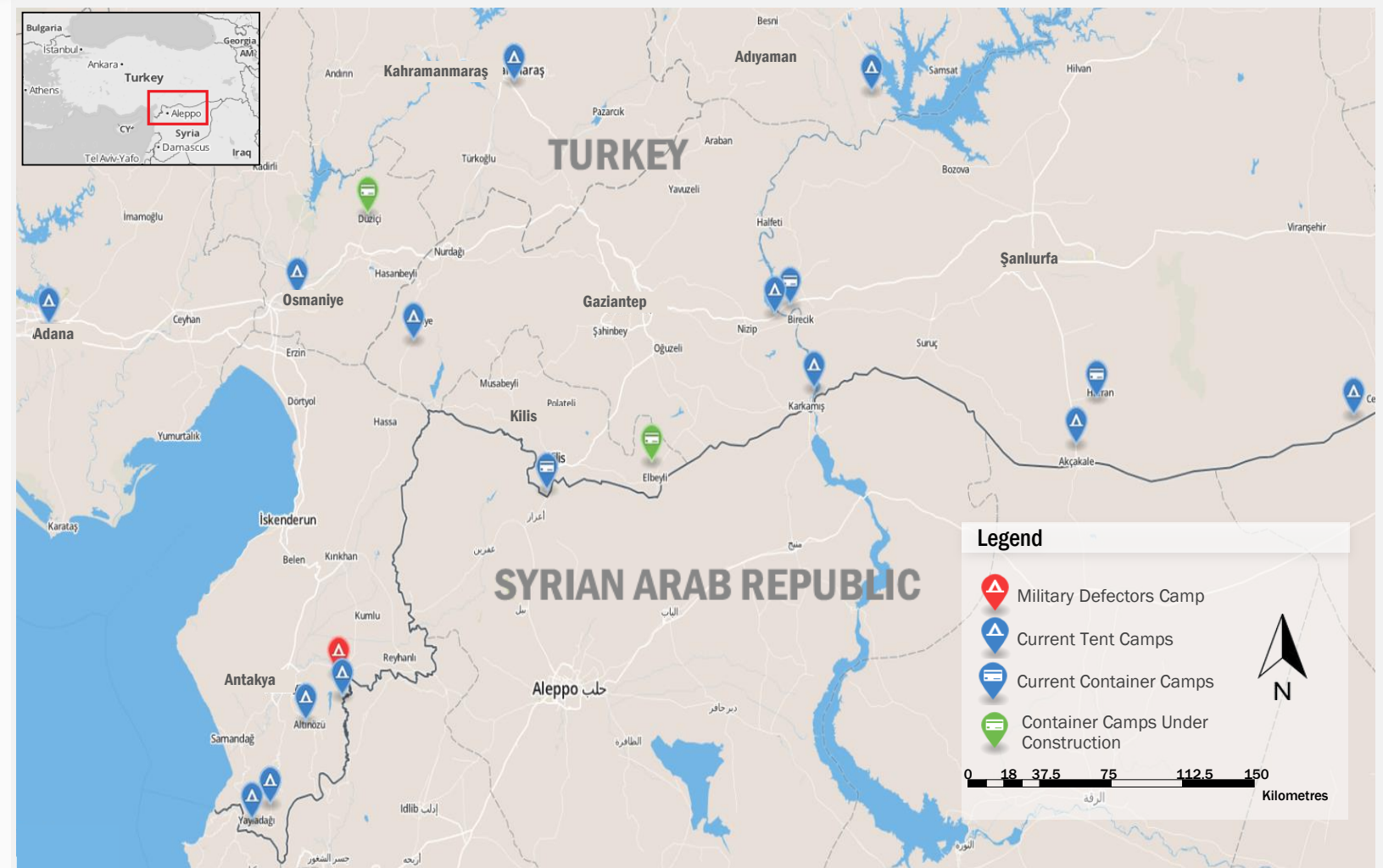
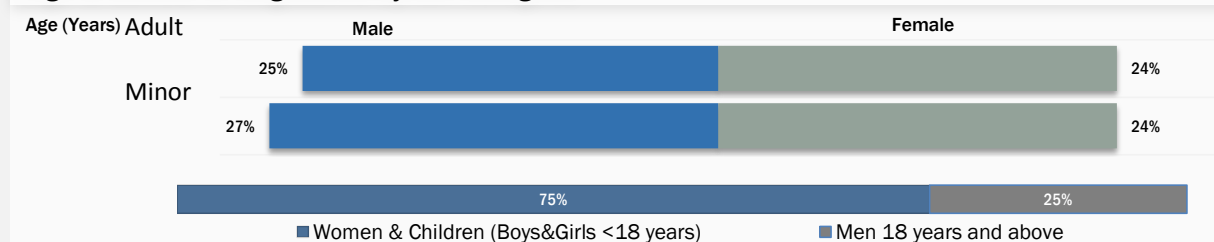
Highlights

- On 27 May 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey announced that the total number of Syrians registered and accommodated in 17 camps in 8 provinces has increased to 195,264 including 398 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals.
- AFAD reported that during the last 24 hrs (26-27 May 2013) 830 new arrival Syrians were registered and accommodated in the camps and 577 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- According to Turkish media, on Sunday 26 May there was an incident at the Ceylanpinar main border crossing, with an exchange of fire between Turkish soldiers and Syrians attempting to cross into Turkey, leaving two Turkish soldiers wounded, one severely.
- After the the incident in Reyhanli, UNHCR Field Teams were informed by the camp officials that the security measures were increased and the daily permissions in some of the camps were even suspended to avoid any unwanted situations. UNHCR Teams were informed that the daily permissions procedures are back to normal routine, and some of the camps have issued seperate ID cards which will can be used on a daily basis by Syrians who are going to town to work as daily workers.
- The situation in Kilis park has remained unchanged. The UNHCR Field Team continues to monitor the situation. Reportedly the number of Syrians living in makeshift tents in the park contined to increase and it estimated that some 3,000 Syrians are living in the makehift tents.A Turkish national NGO brought a mobile kitchen to serve hot meals. Despite the announcement by the local authorities that the Syrians in the park will not be transferred to the new container site in Kilis, people still seem to hope for this transfer and contine to wait.
- In Islahiya camp, the refugee committee and camp management agreed on a joint plan to improve latrine and shower sanitation. A volunteer refugee group will work with five camp staff to clean latrines. Contributions will be solicited at a rate of 2 TL per tented household to pay as incentives to the refugee volunteers.
- Akcakale camp has begun a new registration for Syrians during the last few days. The most vulnerable refugees are identified during the registration, with some 80 people identified as vulnerable in each area. Vulnerable persons include disabled, chronically ill as well as families with missing heads of households.
