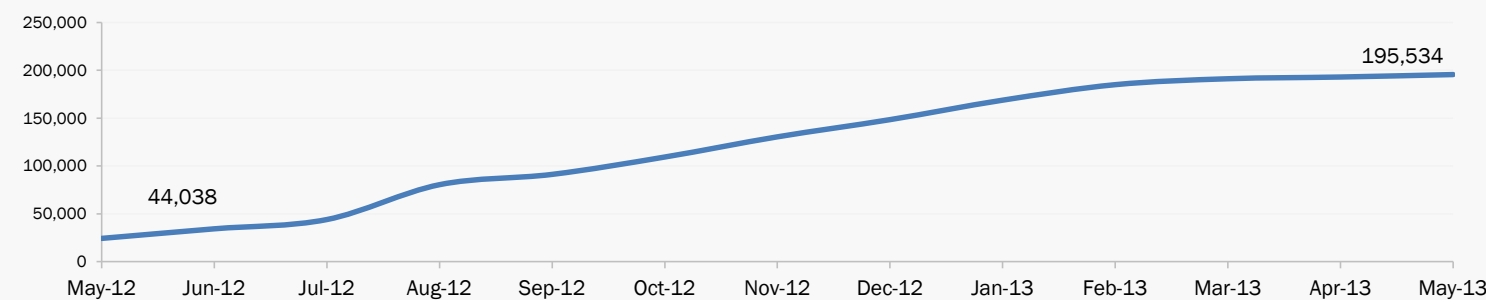
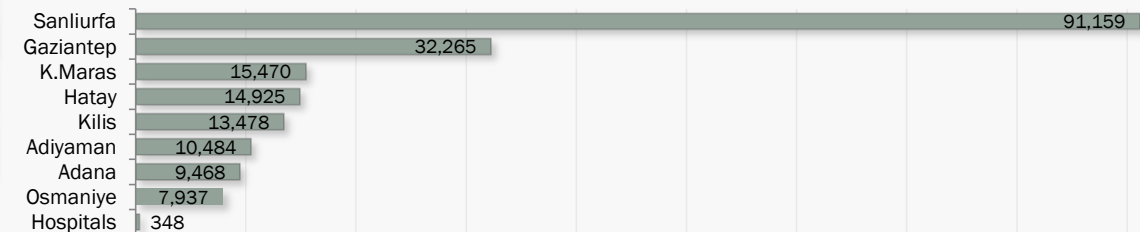


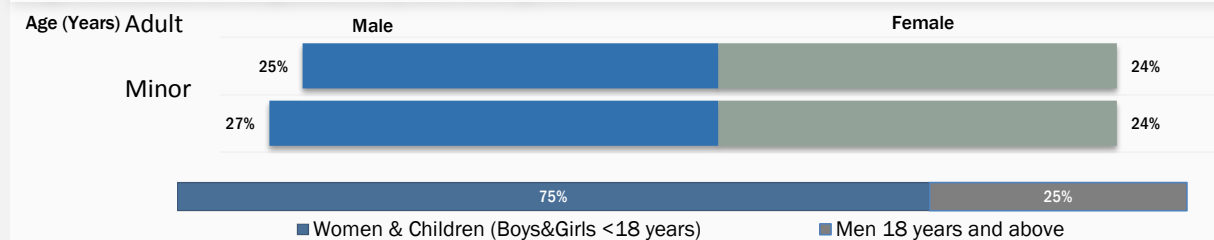

Highlights

- On 28 May 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey announced that the total number of Syrians registered and accommodated in 17 camps in 8 provinces has increased to 195,534 including 348 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals.
- AFAD reported that during the last 24 hrs (27-28 May 2013) 861 new arrival Syrians were registered and accommodated in the camps and 591 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria. According to the official figures from AFAD since the beginning of the crisis, more than 312,000 Syrians have been registered and accommodated in the camps but during the same period of time almost 117,000 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- UNHCR Field Team in Sanliurfa province was informed by the camp management of Akcakale camp that upon request from the Syrians in the camp, an air-conditioned tent was allocated to be used as Rehabilitation tent. Reportedly the Syrians themselves volunteered to provide rehabilitation to people in the camp who require ongoing care. The tent was equipped with basics to be able to provide massage, physiotherapy, exercise and other treatments.
- The number of unregistered people in the camps continues to be one of the major challenges for the camp management. Reportedly majority of these unregistered people in the camps are allowed in as visitors to their relatives however they refuse to leave but continue to stay with their relatives in the same tent. In Kahramanmaraş, the camp management announces in the camps encourage them to approach the registration unit to get themselves registered.
- In Kahramanmaraş province, local police informed that they have started to register the Syrians living in urban. Reportedly after the registration people are advised to move to a camp, The local police estimates that there approximately 3,000 Syrians living in urban in Kahramanmaraş province.
- On 28 May 2013, the UN together with the President of AFAD and Senior Representation of the MFA had a donor meeting with 16 Ambassadors and other Representatives of donor countries, the EU and NGOs. The UN Resident Coordinator and UNHCR Representative announced the launch of RRP5 on 7 June 2013 and presented growing needs of the Syrian Refugee population in Turkey. This was followed by further presentations by Government Officials. The importance of greater support from the international community to address humanitarian needs was stressed.
