Highlight

- UNHCR signed an agreement with the Min. of Interior, Hussein Majali, and the Syrian Refugee Camp Directorate to enhance the security and management of Syrian refugees and asylum seekers who have fled conflict in Syria and currently reside in Zaatari, King Abdullah Park (KAP) and Cyber City.

Security

- A non-camp resident Syrian refugee was stabbed by an unknown group of refugees inside the camp. He was evacuated to the hospital in Ramtha.
- Early evening, 20 kids started to throw stones at the Police at the main gate. The Gendarmerie intervened three kids were arrested three kids. No injuries reported.
- A Syrian guard working for a partner was stabbed in his hand by a refugee who wanted to enter the reception area to meet his relatives. No major injury reported.

Child Protection

- A total of 2,217 children (51% girls) attended psychosocial support in Child Friendly Spaces in Zaatari and King Abdullah Park.

SGBV/GBV

- At the UNFPA / IFH Women and youth spaces 334 beneficiaries attended awareness raising sessions on GBV / RH, individual or group psychosocial support, counselling on reproductive health and edutainment activities for youth.

Education

- School II in Zaatari was officially inaugurated on 4 June, in the presence of EU Commissioner Füle and UNICEF Representative. The school will host 5,000 students. The EU signed a new agreement with UNICEF, bringing an additional 5.5 million Euros to UNICEF's emergency education programme.

Health and Nutrition

- UNICEF/MoH/UNHCR and all partners are working on the hygiene and health education campaign in Zaatari. Since the start of the campaign, 4,450 cases of diarrhea were found in children aged 0-5 years old, and 7,387 households received hygiene promotion sessions.

Food

- In Zaatari camp, WFP distributed dry rations to family size six and is prepared to reach the UNHCR manifest of 147,312 refugees for the first June cycle. In Jordanian communities, voucher distributions are ongoing with plans to reach more than 230,000 beneficiaries in June.

WASH

- UNICEF/JEN received official government approval to start WASH-in-School in host communities, finished assessing 474 schools in five governorates (Amman, Ma'raq, Irbid, Ma'an and Zarqa).
