



Highlights

- On 09 June 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and accommodated in 18 camps in 8 provinces has increased to 198,371, including 360 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the last 3 days (07-09 June 2013), 2,947 new arrival Syrians were registered and accommodated in the camps and 1,462 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- During the weekend, AFAD officially reported two more camps in its Daily information Note, bringing the total number of camps to 19 in 9 provinces. The recent camps are the second container site in Kilis Elbeyli Beseriye with 20,000 capacity, and the tent site in Mardin Midyat with 10,000 capacity.
- AFAD has included in its statistics of 09 June the population of 1,321 Syrians now admitted to the new container site in Kilis Elbeyli-Beseriye. The authorities have informed UNHCR that priority will be given to the Syrian IDPs in Bab-Al-Salame, as well as the vulnerable families living in urban Kilis.
- No admissions for the tent site in Mardin-Midyat h province have yet been reported. During meetings with the local authorities last month, UNHCR was informed that part of the camp will be allocated for non-Muslims, mainly Assyrians, who have been living in urban and supported by the local community.
- While the registration of the non-camp Syrians is on going in two main Coordination Centers run by AFAD in Gaziantep and Sanliurfa provinces, some other Governorates are also conducting enumeration exercise in their provinces. As of end of last week Gaziantep Coordination Center registered almost 40,000 and gave appointments to 25,000 Syrians, while about 6,000 have been registered by Sanliurfa Coordination Center.
- In terms of living conditions, Syrians in urban locations in Gaziantep have informed UNHCR that housing in particular is difficult to find, with landlords increasing rents, deposits and insurance or refusing to rent apartments to them. Syrians noted that since the bombing incident in Reyhanli, work and housing have been increasingly difficult to find.
