





REGIONAL as of 23 August


■ Jordan ■ Lebanon ■ Turkey ■ Iraq ■ Egypt

- RRP 5 Total : **USD 976,576,971**
- Funding Received: **USD 457,758,594**
- Jordan is **47% funded**
- Lebanon 38%; Turkey 26%; Iraq 23%;
Egypt 22% funded

JORDAN



ACHEIVEMENTS - GENERAL

- Over **500,000** refugees have been welcomed and assisted by Jordan
- A co-ordinated response by the Government of Jordan, with support from donors, UN, NGOs and CBOs.
- Meeting RRP5 targets in terms of % coverage in key sectors, especially in camps

SHELTER & SITE



- **12,50,055 m²** of camp space developed in 2013
- Total capacity at **267,000** (Target: 300,000)
- **57,906** tents in camps provided (Target: 69,000)
- **15,374** shelters in camps supported with winterisation materials
- **1,368** sealing off & home repairs in urban
- **12,327** prefabs distributed to refugees in camps

FOOD



- **302,781** individuals received food assistance through food vouchers (per month)
- **133,941** individuals in camp received food assistance through in-kind general food distribution (per month)

NON-FOOD ITEMS



- **88,103** jerry cans distributed
- **142,661** hygiene kits for new arrivals distributed
- **416,976** blankets distributed
- **74,746** kitchen sets distributed
- **7,767** heating stoves distributed
- **35,894** clothes sets distributed
- **257,060** mattress distributed

WASH



- **35 litres** per person per day in camp
- **144,884** beneficiaries with access to adequate latrines
- **122,017** beneficiaries of water trucking; with access to shower facilities; solid waste collection and disposal services
- **50,867** beneficiaries connected to the water network
- **201,920** beneficiaries reached through hygiene promotion

CASH



- **8,246 families** receive urgent Cash Assistance (one-time) to address urgent vulnerability
- **9,550 families** receive regular cash assistance as a cash complement towards basic household needs (conditional)
- **24,930 families** receive regular cash assistance as a cash complement towards basic household needs (unconditional)
- **15,718 families** receive seasonal cash assistance to address specific vulnerabilities supported with cash for rent

HEALTH



- **82%** children 6 m to <15 years in Zaatri vaccinated against measles and **86%** in Irbid and Mafraq
- **3,423,695 USD** in-kind (vaccines, cold chain) to MoH (UNICEF) ; **5,120,000 USD** essential medicines by MoH (WHO)
- **29,238** mothers receive Infant/Young Child feeding services
- **660** refugees receive life-saving, essential tertiary care
- **18,800** refugees receive counseling/awareness-raising on RH
- **88%** deliveries in Zaatri with skilled attendant
- **553** service providers trained in various aspects of MHSSP

EDUCATION



- **44,098** school aged Syrian vulnerable children supported with formal education services
- **83** schools supported with double-shifted operation, extension of classrooms
- **64,739** vulnerable Syrian and Jordanian children in host communities receive education related supplies
- **35** schools undergo small scale renovations and refurbishment (19,214 children)
- **22,563** school-aged children in host communities and in camps benefit from informal and non-formal education services.
- **10,474** children with specific needs have access to specialized educational and psychological services in camps and host communities

PROTECTION



- **485,819** total active Syrian refugees registered (1 Sept)
- **2,660** UAC/SC and children at risk received multi-sectoral services (Target **3,800**)
- **1,512** SGBV survivors supported or referred (Target **2,100**)
- **95,558** individuals benefited from psychosocial support
- **86** child and youth friendly spaces and **24** women safe spaces operational
- **6,342** individuals with specific needs received special support
