NEEDS

Syrians often arrive to countries of asylum with few personal possessions and savings are soon depleted. For refugees living in camps, the most basic domestic items are needed to adapt to camp life, including jerry cans to transport water and for washing, kitchen sets and stoves for food preparation as well as blankets for warmth and tent insulation. For Syrians not residing in camps, accommodation is often found with host families, in sparsely furnished apartments or other ad-hoc housing solutions, with little funds to purchase needed domestic items. Children, especially those of school-age, are support in their enrollment and school retention through clothing support. RRP5 partners coordinate the purchase, logistics and distribution plans of core relief items in sector working groups. In some hosting countries, the provision of cash assistance is intended to support the purchase of basic domestic items.

KEY AUGUST DEVELOPMENTS

In **Lebanon**, the sector working group provided support to the Emergency Response Fund (ERF) process, winterization strategy as well as developing a standardized assistance package. In **Turkey** cooking facility items are distributed in camps by the Turkish Red Crescent Society. Procurement of mobile coordination/registration centers was supported and a central warehouse was identified in the south-eastern Turkey. In **Iraq**, NFIs were distributed to the majority of arrivals into the camps in Erbil governorate. Winterization planning was initiated by sector working group participants. Shelter, Cash and NFI sectors in **Jordan** have developed a harmonized approach to winterization planning and preparations. This includes defining assistance packages, and setting a cash equivalent to the standard NFI package. As part of contingency planning, the sector has been compiling available NFI stock lists for all organizations, facilitating gaps analysis. In **Egypt**, partners' capacity for vulnerability assessments was increased, which has reduced waiting periods for those applying for cash assistance.
