


## Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees



## Highlights

- On 02 October 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps in 10 provinces was 200,085, including 623 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 24hrs of 01-02 Oct. 2013, a total of 580 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 556 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- The UNHCR Field Team was informed by the local officials that the Akcakale border crossing gate has been open since mid Sept. In addition to those holding passports, several thousands of Syrians who had been waiting at the gate in Telabyad were allowed in. Reportedly on some days there were several hundreds, while on other days it went up to a few thousands. It has not been clarified yet how many of these people were transferred to the camps. The majority are presumed to stay in urban areas or with their relatives in the nearby villages on the Turkish side of the border.
- In the two big camps of Sanliurfa province (Akcakale and Ceylanpinar camps), officials started to replace the tents. In Akcakale camp, the replacement of the old tents with the tents donated by UNHCR has been on-going for a while, and has recently started in Ceylanpinar. The camp management is expecting to complete the replacement of all the tents in about 2 months.
- In Kahramanmaras, the camp officials informed UNHCR Field Team that they are thinking of building a prefab school with 12 classrooms which should allow the children of non-camp Syrians access to education. UNHCR Team learned that there is a school in city center of Kahramanmaras run by Syrians who informed that last year they had 300 students, which increased to 750 in 2013. However, due to financial constraints and lack of support by the local officials, the school may be closed down. The management is also planning to build a new prefab hospital and the a prefab for management offices.
- The local officials in the Kahramanmaras camp informed that they have also started the re-registration of the camp population with digital finger prints (about 200 persons per day registered and fingerprinted), and cross-checked with the existing centralized data-base. More than 3,000 re-registrations of the camp population have already been completed. The same system is also applied to the non-camp Syrians living in Kahramanmaras city center, and about 1,000 Syrians have been registered so far.
- The camp management of Kahramanmaras informed UNHCR that some 6,400 hygiene kits donated by South Korea and Germany have been distributed to camp residents. In both camps of Hatay Yayladagi, upon request from the camp residents, the management opened a Turkish language class in addition to TOMER, and some 60 adults were registered.
