


## Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees



## Highlights

- On 03 October 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps in 10 provinces was 200,083, including 623 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 24hrs of 02-03 Oct. 2013, a total of 436 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 438 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- The Transit Center on the way between Gaziantep and Kilis is about to be completed. The local officials organized a coordination meeting with the participation of local NGOs, Kizilay and UNHCR. During the meeting, the Dept. Governor informed the participants that they are planning to start the transfer of the non-camp Syrians living in the parks and mosques on Monday. It is estimated that some 3,000 people can be accommodated in the center with some additional tents added.
- During a visit to Nizip-1 Camp, a UNHCR Field Team observed that the officials started to add some toilets in the school area built in concrete. The camp manager was advised if they could also replace the existing showers and toilets with concrete built ones to solve the water leakages that cause sanitation challenges in the Camp. In Islahiye, the UNHCR WATSAN expert also observed similar problems and advised the camp officials. Reportedly the camp officials are working on this issue and will soon start replacement. It was also advised to the camp management that when replacing the toilets and showers, the needs for disabled people should be also considered.
- Although the new education semester started as of 16 Sep. in most of the camps, the registration of the children for the school in many camps is still on-going. In Akcakale the number of children enrolled to school is over 7,000 and in Adiyaman over 3,000. In Islahiye camp the UNHCR Field Team was informed that that some 800 children at school age did not register for school yet and the social workers are conducting visits to the families to understand the reason and encourage the families to send their children to school. In Elbeyli camp, officials informed that 6,000 children are registered for school and the teachers expressed their challenges because of overcrowded classrooms.
- In Malatya Beydagi camp, officials informed UNHCR Field Team that they are in contact with the University of Malatya to organize Turkish Language Courses by TOMER. In the meantime, upon request from the camp residents, the Malatya camp management will organize Turkish classes by Public Education Department in Malatya. As for the normal school the officials informed that some 3,000 children are expected to register and another 400 children for the kindergarten.
- In Osmaniye, the camp management informed UNHCR Team that they will organize a commission composed of 5 Syrian teachers, the deputy camp manager, social workers and education coordinators. The commission will be in charge of regular controls of attendance of children to school, organize beneficial trainings, educational activities, establishment of the library and determine pedagogical needs.
