

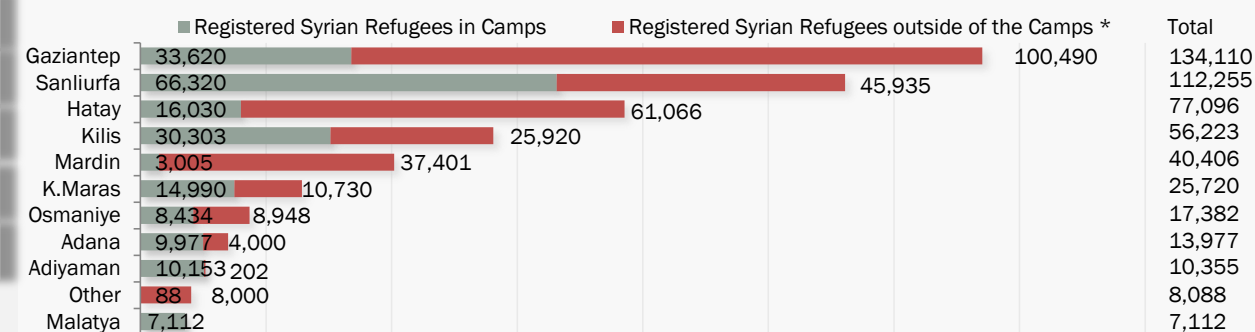
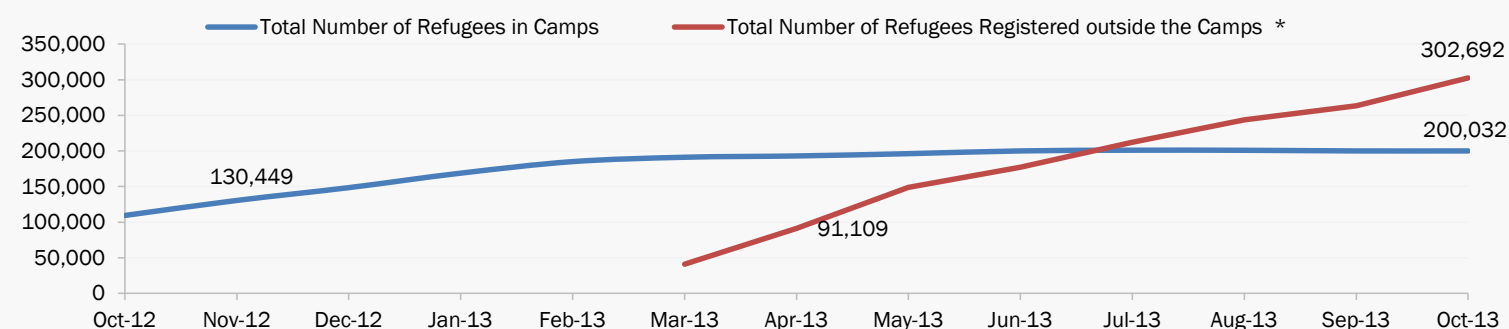
## UNHCR Turkey Syrian Refugee Daily Sitrep

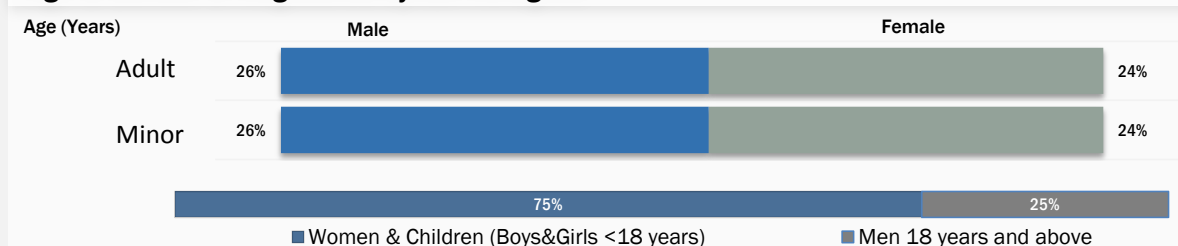

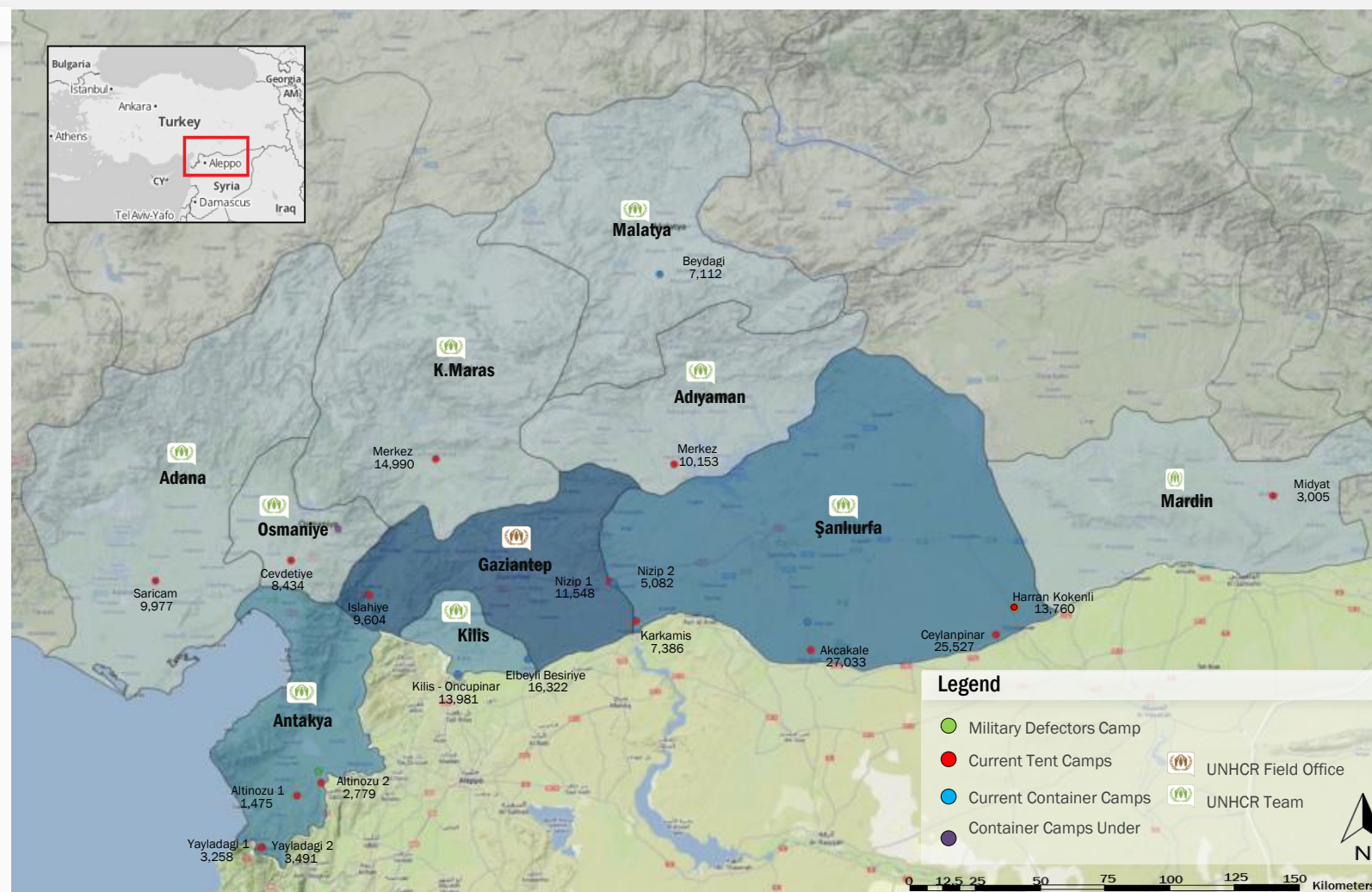


### Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees



## Highlights

- On 21 October 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps in 10 provinces was 200,032 including 88 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the last 24hrs (20-21 Oct 2013), a total of 364 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 377 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Kilis Oncupinar container site, the officials informed UNHCR that there are still between 1,000 and 2,000 un-registered Syrians living in the camp with their relatives and/or in makeshift annexes to the containers. As the re-registration of the camp residents is on-going, the officials reported that they will also register these people. In addition to the un-registered refugees in the camp, there are also some 300 Syrians waiting outside the camp waiting to be admitted and accommodated in the camp. Reportedly in order to accommodate these additional un-registered Syrians in and outside the camp, the officials have received some 160 additional containers and the infrastructure for these additional containers is almost completed.
- Local officials in Mardin informed UNHCR that the police started to register the non-camp Syrians living in Mardin. Reportedly the registration is conducted in the camp and so far about 1,371 Syrians were registered and issued ID cards. In Mardin city center the police is also registering the non-camp Syrians in need of urgent medical assistance and a document is provided to have access to hospitals.
- In Mardin, the local police informed UNHCR that Syrians who are mostly of Kurdish origin continues to approach them with the request to return to Syria and police is facilitating their safe return and crossing to Syria. Reportedly during the period of 01-20 Oct 2013, the police has facilitated the return of 9,647 persons to Syria through Senyurt military crossing point in Kiziltepe. The police also informed that 1,953 Syrians were registered and issued a referral letter to approach one of the camps as they stated they have no place to stay.
- In Mardin Midyat Camp, officials informed that they have distributed additional blankets (1 per person) to the camp residents. UNHCR is also in the process of procurement of electrical heaters for all the camps. Due to the colder temperatures in Mardin and Malatya provinces, priority will be given to these two camps with emergency procurement within the next few days.
