


## Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees



## Highlights

- On 31 October 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps in 10 provinces was 200,024 including 97 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 24hrs (30-31 Oct 2013), a total of 525 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 510 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- Within support to the winterization of the camps, UNHCR procured 2,550 electrical heaters for Mardin/Midyat tent camp and Malatya/Beydagi container site. 700 of the heaters were delivered to Mardin Midyat container site during the week and 1,850 heaters are expected to be delivered to Malatya Beydagi container site during the weekend.
- In Sanliurfa Harran Container site the camp management informed UNHCR that they received 7,600 UNHCR blankets from the Kizilay warehouse and distributed 6,100 to the camp residents and are expecting some 2,400 more. In Akcakale the camp management received about 11,000 UNHCR blankets and are expecting some 4,000 more which will then be distributed to the camp residents.
- The renovation of the camp in Karkamis is still on going. Reportedly 75% of the tents were replaced by the new tents provided by UNHCR. While the tents are replaced the foundation of the tents is also leveled. The camp management informed that they have some 60 people who were moved from the nearby mosque in Karkamis to the camp and are temporarily accommodated in a container in the camp. They will be moved to family tents as they become available following voluntary returns of other residents.
- Local officials informed UNHCR that the Kilis Oncupinar border gate is still closed however the wounded cases are admitted when needed. Reportedly this increased the number of spontaneous returns of those with passport from Karkamis border gate. The local officials informed that they have restricted the goods of the returnees to the capacity of their vehicles because several people were trying to overload the vehicles with commercial goods to take to Syria.
