


Highlights

- On 04 November 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps in 10 provinces was 200,048 including 98 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 48hrs (02-04 Nov. 2013), a total of 711 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 733 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Mardin local officials informed UNHCR that following the circular from Ministry of Education in end September 2013, the governorate decided to support the school that has been opened in Kiziltepe by an NGO. Reportedly the governorate intends to open 3 more schools in Nusaybin, Midyat and Mardin city center as well as the second one in Kiziltepe in order to accommodate more children of non-camp Syrians living in Mardin province.
- In Ceylanpinar camp the renovation of tents is on-going. Reportedly the work in four districts of the camp have been completed and all the tents are replaced with UNHCR tents which have been delivered in the summer. Local officials informed that they are moving the residents of the districts to the rub hall tents established in the camp as waiting area for some days until the district is leveled, electricity wires are strengthened and tents are replaced. The officials informed that they are also replacing the electric wires in case they will switch from hot meal distribution to a card system.
- UNHCR will provide winter clothing to the children at 4-17 years old in all the camps. The procurement process is completed and the clothes are planned to be dispatched to the camps within the next few weeks. UNHCR also will deliver books in Arabic which were collected through some private donations to Adana camp this week. The books mainly are for children as well as a few novels for 15 years and above.
- In Mardin the local platform composed of local NGOs informed UNHCR that they have provided assistance to some 600 families registered/enumerated by the by platform in the villages. Reportedly the assistance included cash assistance (60-70 thousand Turkish Lira in total, which is approx. \$30-35,000), meat during Eid period as well as 1,800 aid boxes which included food and hygiene material. The platform also collects donations from local communities, charity organizations and private companies and distributes these to non-camp Syrians living in Mardin province.
