

Highlights

- On 11 November 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps in 10 provinces was 202,474 including 93 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 24hr of 10-11 Nov. 2013 a total of 220 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 271 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- Since the beginning of the crisis in April 2011, 405,611 persons registered and accommodated in the camps. Reportedly some 50% have returned to Syria voluntarily, the number of refugees currently in the camps is around 200,000. It is not clear from the report the number of persons who have registered, returned to Syria, and re-registered in Turkish camps or in urban areas.
- Camp officials informed UNHCR that they continue to have challenges accommodating the spontaneous arrivals at the camps' gates. Reportedly while giving priority to the core family members who commit to stay with their families, they also admit vulnerable people, including single women, women with children etc. , despite the shortage of space.
- In Nizip-1 and Nizip-2 camps, officials informed UNHCR that they have established football teams and started to organize a football tournament among the 4 camps of Gaziantep province. In Harran Container site the camp officials also established a football team and games are organized with local local teams. UNHCR Field Teams will advocate to establish a tournament among all the camps.
- UNHCR Field Teams were informed by the camp managers of Adiyaman, Kahramanmaraş and Osmaniye that with the support of New Zealand Government, a prefab school was built in these camps, which were all opened during last week with the participation of local officials as well as representatives from the New Zealand Government.
