

Highlights

- On 13 November 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps in 10 provinces was 202,445 including 89 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 24hr of 12-13 Nov. 2013 a total of 175 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 523 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- UNHCR was informed by an International NGO that they are working on providing assistance packages for winterization to about 4,900 families/households living in Kilis. Reportedly the assistance package that is intended to be distributed will contain blankets, clothing, sleeping mats and a plastic jerry can. The NGO will approach the local officials in Kilis to discuss the modalities for distribution and the selection of potential vulnerable beneficiaries.
- Local officials in several camps informed UNHCR Field Staff that TOMER classes (Turkish Language courses) will soon begin in many camps. Reportedly there has been an increase in participants amongst the youth. While some of those who attended the course during previous semester but could not pass the proficiency exam, there are also new applicants who would like to attend the course.
- In Gaziantep AFAD Coordination Center, the officials informed UNHCR that as of 7 October, the foreigners police took over the registration of non-camp Syrians. Since the opening of the Center in Jan-2013 until 13 Nov. 2013 almost 85,000 non-camp Syrians have been registered in Gaziantep (including those who were registered by AFAD before the police took over). The center officials informed that in the new database program, through the finger print records, the bio data of the applicant can be cross-checked with the camps' records.
