

Highlights

- On 18 November 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps in 10 provinces was 203,683 including 92 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 24 hrs. of 17-18 Nov. 2013 a total of 1,135 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 253 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Gaziantep city the Foreigners Police continue to register non-camp Syrians in the city center, while in Nizip town in Gaziantep province, AFAD continues to register those who are in need of urgent medical assistance. Reportedly since 25 Oct. 2013, AFAD registered 360 non-camp Syrians in Nizip town, which brought the total number of registered non-camp Syrians in Nizip to 13,442 persons. The AFAD Coordination Center in Gaziantep informed UNHCR that they do the same for those who are in need of immediate medical assistance so their costs can be covered by AFAD. In Gaziantep, out of total more than 91,000 registered non-camp Syrians, only 5% have so far been registered by the police since 7 Oct 2013 when it took over the registration.
- It was officially announced in the national media that the Ministry of Health will soon start to vaccinate about 1 million children under 5 years of age against polio in 7 provinces along the border with Syria and about half a million children in other provinces. Public Health Agency officials stated to the media that over 4,000 health personnel will be deployed for this campaign. Officials reported that there is no case of polio yet detected but they are taking precautions to prevent any possible outbreak.
- In Nizip town the Office of the Religious Affairs informed UNHCR that there are about 12 schools for non-camp Syrians' children living in Nizip town. Reportedly about 2,000 Syrian children are enrolled in these schools that are run by the Syrian teachers. Officials of the Office of Religious Affairs reported that they provided in-kind support to Syrians who have temporarily resided in the mosques (approximately was about 2,000 persons) in Nizip town. The Head of Religious Affairs also informed that they are currently providing 100 TL per teacher from their budget. He said he had also included messages of tolerance and support in the Friday prayers in support of the Syrians.
