

Highlights

- On 19 November 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps in 10 provinces was 203,996 including 85 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 24 hrs. of 18-19 Nov. 2013 a total of 562 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 249 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Sanliurfa province the UNHCR Team was informed that 3 new schools have been opened for Syrians living in the city. UNHCR met with the Syrian teachers who work in the schools on a voluntary basis. Reportedly more than 1,200 children have enrolled so far and the number may still increase. The teachers informed that their main challenge is the shortage of space to admit more children. The teachers were informed by local officials that 4 more containers will be provided by AFAD, while they have started the schooling with the existing capacity.
- In many camps, officials informed UNHCR that spontaneous arrivals continue to be a challenge. In Karkamis, 50 more persons arrived after the previous group of 60 were provided family tents. In Elbeyli container site 6 families were admitted last week and since then 41 more families arrived. During the weekend and after they were not admitted, they started to live in the 12 containers which are placed at the gate of the container site pending repair. Also, 70 single men who had been transferred and registered in Nizip-1 camp decided not to stay in the camp.
- In Mardin the local police informed UNHCR that the registration of the non-camp Syrians is on-going. Reportedly the police registered almost 5,000 non-camp Syrians in Mardin while the total number of non-camp Syrians registered by AFAD before the police took over was more than 37,000 including the city center and surrounding towns.
- In Sanliurfa, local officials informed UNHCR that they considered opening a crossing point in Ceylanpinar town to facilitate the crossing of the spontaneous returns of the Syrians who prefer to transit from Ceylanpinar to Ras Al Ayn. However, the idea has been suspended for security reasons. The spontaneous returns will continue to be processed from Mardin Senyurt crossing point.
