

## Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees



## Highlights

- On 21 November 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps in 10 provinces was 204,614 including 154 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the last 2 days of 19 - 21 Nov. 2013 1,644 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 1,026 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Adana Saricam camp 3 sociologists were recently appointed by the Ministry of Family and Social Policies (MFSP). The new staff informed UNHCR that they have started to organize training workshops for women. The theme of the first workshop was "communication within the family". The sociologists requested UNHCR to provide support and a guidance to improve their presentations and organize more gender and culture-sensitive themes. Similar workshops are also planned by the social workers of MFSP. The social workers are planning to prepare leaflets on "rights of children" and general rules and regulations within the camp.
- In Akcakale camp, the youth committee conducted another survey and identified 173 disabled residents. There are already 30 disabled children attending to the special class (rehabilitation center) for disabled children. The head of education unit informed that they have about 750 children attending kindergarten in 15 classes. Reportedly they are in need of more space to open additional classes.
- In Kahramanmaraş, the local officials informed that they have completed the re-registration of all the camp residents and they started to distribute the new ID cards and take the old ones back. Reportedly, in Kahramanmaraş province, about 13,000 non-camp Syrians have been identified -- almost 8,000 of them are also registered. The officials informed the UNHCR team that they estimate that some 4,000 children who should attend school, but for whom there are no spaces available. Officials are trying to find a solution for this group, including a new school for non-camp Syrians.
- The Turkish Language Course provided by TOMER (Turkish Language Learning Center) will start during last week of November. One teacher was assigned to Akcakale camp by TOMER. However, officials in Akcakale camp stated that due to the increased number of students who wish to learn Turkish, they will request more teachers.
