


Highlights

- On 26 November 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps in 10 provinces was 205,305 including 156 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 48hrs of (24- 26 Nov. 2013) 764 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 928 Syrians have returned to Syria.
- A UNHCR field team met with local officials in the Senyurt military controlled crossing point in the town of Kiziltepe, Mardin province. Officials informed UNHCR that they are processing the spontaneous returns of 700 Syrians to Syria on daily average. Reportedly these Syrians are approaching the officials spontaneously and requesting their return to be processed. The officials informed that about 70% of them are Kurdish origin but there are also Arabs and some Assyrians. The majority of them are coming from camps. The officials stated that on a daily basis they also have up to 200 Syrians crossing to Turkey and they are advised to approach one of the camps and some are referred to Mardin Camp.
- UNHCR field team discussed the registration of non-camp Syrians in Mardin province with the deputy governor and the foreigners police. Officials informed UNHCR that while the police continues to register non-camp Syrians in Midyat camp itself, another police office is registering those who are in need of a card for access to medical assistance in the city of Mardin. Officials also informed that they will accelerate the opening of the coordination center in Mardin city and may consider opening an annexes in Kiziltepe, Nusaybin and Midyat as these towns host large numbers of non-camp Syrians.
- In Nizip-1 camp, officials informed that they continue to face the challenges with spontaneous arrivals approaching the camps. Reportedly, there are about 358 Syrians waiting in the waiting area (temporarily accommodated in a big rub hall) of whom 119 have come during last week. Officials provide temporary accommodation until they have vacant tents after voluntary returns.
- UNHCR Field Teams were informed by the camp managements that as per instructions from AFAD, there will be no more money loaded to the cards of beneficiaries for the purchase of NFIs (hygiene items); instead camp officials (AFAD) will donate NFIs to refugees in the camps.
