

Highlights

- On 02 December 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps in 10 provinces was 205,793 including 138 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 48hrs of (01-02 Dec. 2013) 555 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 364 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Kilis transit center, local officials and management informed UNHCR that the situation has improved over the past weeks. About 24 representatives from the Syrians (muktars) including two females have been identified and have established regular meetings with camp staff to discuss issues of concern. About 10 Syrians are working as volunteers assisting the management in food distribution. The Child Friendly space has been opened by the International Blue Crescent (IBC) and has about 600 children registered and attending activities in three shifts. In addition IBC provided the transit center with 30 latrines and 32 showers.
- The Deputy Governor in charge of the Kilis Elbeyli camp, informed that there are about 150 containers in the camp to accommodate more residents. Reportedly the new admissions to the camp will be from Bab Al Salame IDP camp (SAR). The date of admission is not yet known.
- In Kilis city center, the Multi purpose Community Center (called CATOM) which was opened about two years ago with one female and seven male teachers for the local community also admitted non-camp Syrians in Kilis into their activities. Reportedly they have about 20 Syrian women attending their sewing courses and about 30 Syrians to the Turkish language classes. Each course lasts about seven months.
- In Ceylanpinar camp officials informed that they are getting up to 60-70 Syrians on a daily basis approaching the camp spontaneously. While some are claiming to have family members in the camp, the camp management believes that they may come to the camp due to difficult conditions in the urban areas. Additionally, the food card system that will start soon (AFAD and not WFP) and there is the possibility of being transferred to Viransehir camp which may open soon. Camp management also stated that some of these people have been registered in the camp before but have been living in urban or in villages with their relatives.
