Draft UNHCR /UNICEF/WFP Assessment:</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Secondary data analysis forming as a basis for the RRP6 covering both Syrian refugees and Jordanian host communities</li> <li>• Increase of negative coping strategies while also a more diverse diet in communities than camp settings</li> <li>• Expected increased diversities once voucher introduction completed in camps</li> <li>• Protection concerns to be included</li> </ul> <p><b><u>b. Objectives, Outputs and Indicators</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Objectives have been submitted to UNHCR</li> <li>• Sector objectives are based on strategic objectives by UNHCR</li> <li>• On 15 September the RRP6 was launched and the main decisions made during the planning workshop were presented</li> </ul> <p>The four main objectives are:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Maintain food security and improve food availability, access and utilisation for Syrian refugees in Jordan through appropriate and consistent food assistance</li> <li>2. Improve food security including food availability, access and utilisation for vulnerable Jordanian populations through targeted food production and livelihood interventions</li> <li>3. Improve the nutritional status of Syrian refugees, particularly malnourished girls and boys under the age of five and pregnant and lactating mothers</li> <li>4. Ensure effective and coordinated sectoral response through evidence-based food security and livelihood interventions</li> </ol> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The objectives are separated into objectives for Syrians and Jordanians; in line with the overall strategic objectives for the RRP6</li> </ul>	<p>Draft assessment to be circulated to FSWG for feedback by Thursday 10 October</p> <p>RRP6 Sector Objectives to be circulated to FSWG for additional feedback by Thursday 10 October</p> <p>FSWG members to upload planned activities under RRP6 into ActivityInfo by Tuesday 15 October</p>

ActivityInfo:</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Each output will indicate the type of targeted population (Syrians in camps, Syrians in Urban, Other affected populations), the location and then the total financial requirements (which will then be classified into one of the 3 priority categories – life-saving, preventing deterioration and capacity building/resilience)</li> <li>• RRP6 matrix presented to Food Sector to be filled with outputs, activities and indicators</li> <li>• Input information by those who attended training</li> </ul>

RRP5 achievements and RRP6 narrative/activities/output information</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• World Vision planning to distribute 1,000 MT of rice in local communities for unregistered refugees</li> </ul>	<p>FSWG members to submit any related comments by Thursday 10 October</p>

RRP6 Food Sector Response Strategy</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• First draft to be prepared by WFP following the finalization of the needs assessment and agreement on the sector objectives, outputs and indicators along with each participating organisations' planned activities under the RRP6</li> </ul>	<p>Circulate narrative with FSWG once first draft completed</p>
