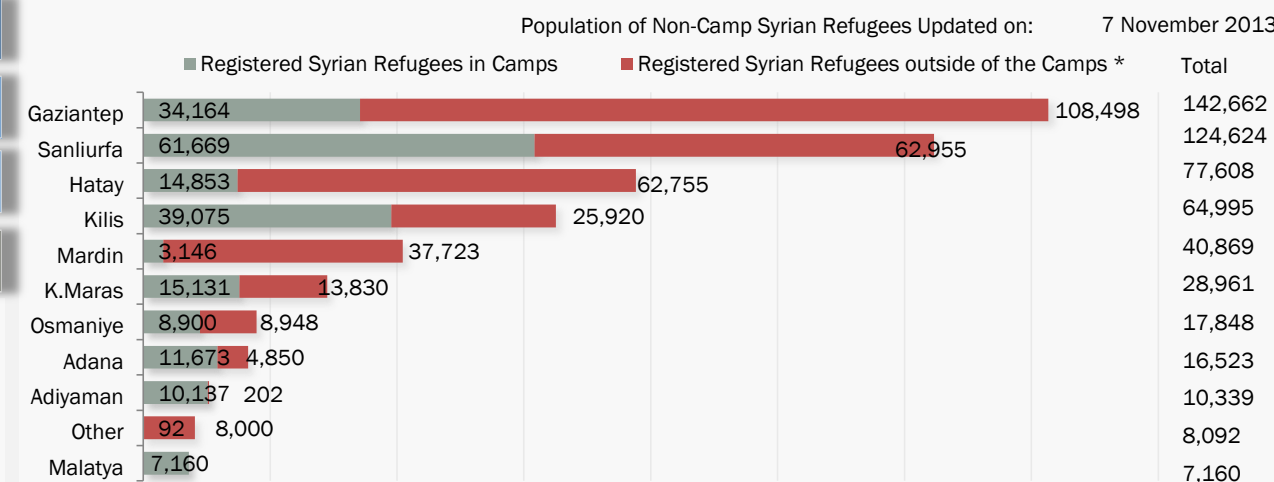
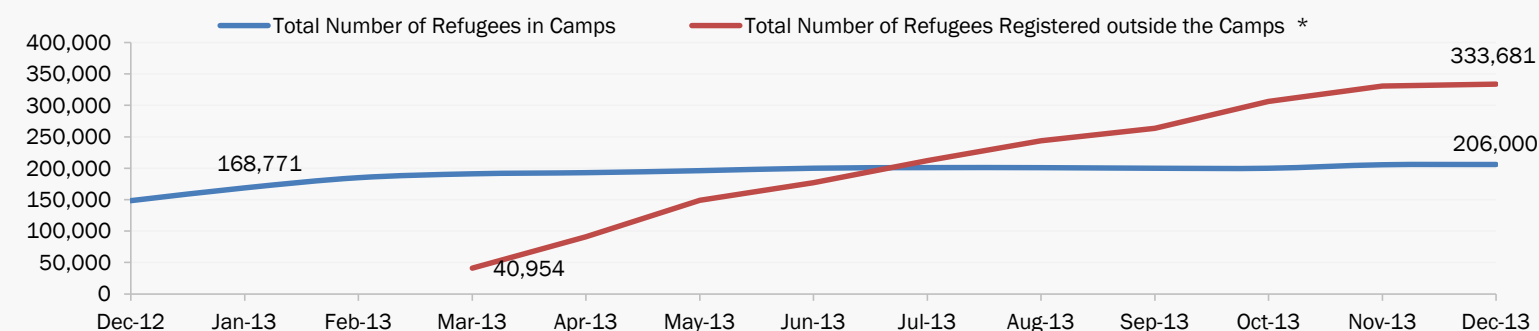


Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	<b>539,681</b>

## Highlights

- On 08 December 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps in 10 provinces was 206,000 including 92 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the week-end and on Friday (06-08 Dec. 2013) 987 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 839 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- During the weekend (7-8 Dec.) AFAD Provincial Directorate in Sanliurfa province informed UNHCR that they would start to accommodate Syrians in Viransehir camp. The camp had been completed for months; however, it had been kept as a reserve in the event of an influx of refugees. The camp has a capacity of 20,000 persons and all residential tents are provided by UNHCR. Initially hot meals will be given to camp residents until the markets and a card system are established.
- Local AFAD officials informed that they intend to move some 900 people from Ceylanpinar camp and about 1,550 persons from Akcakale camp to Viransehir. Reportedly these people have been accommodated in the rub halls used as waiting areas prior to receiving access to a family tent. Living conditions in the rub halls are difficult and some of the tents in Ceylanpinar were flooded last week due to heavy rains. On Saturday night (07 Dec.) UNHCR team learned from AFAD staff that 6 minibuses of Syrians arrived at Viransehir camp. Reportedly the people were immediately accommodated in family tents and will be registered,
- In Ceylanpinar, camp officials informed that they have received 172 rub hall tents to be used for educational facilities and social activities. Reportedly after they complete the renewal of the residential tents, they will also renew the educational and social facilities tents. Reportedly the primary school tents are also planned to be renewed and collected in the education area. Currently the primary schools are in each neighborhood while secondary and high school classes are in educational area.
- In Akcakale Camp, a total of 7,789 children are registered in school from 1st to 12th grade. This is about 30% of the total camp population. The school administration informed the UNHCR field team that they are tracking each child's attendance and if a child is absent for one week, a visit is made to the family in their tent to discuss the importance of school attendance.
