5.0 AOB

Summary of discussions

- **5.1** Sharing of UNICEF field team TOR in the camp. They are briefed on how to operate in the field. The link between the team and Oxfam is already established. JEN and ACTED to call Mr. Mohammed AlHamwan to confirm the time to connect with them.
- **5.2** Discussion was held on the Issue on decontaminating soil after flooding. Organizations were asked to explore further and come up with ideas. Jordanian government doesn't allow the use of chlorine. A concern was raised that due to the Jordanian regulations chemicals can't be disposed off to the ground, and other ideas were discussed.
- **5.3** Agreement on minimum standards discussed again to decide where to start with repairs and handovers of WASH facilities in old districts.
- **5.4** Discussion was held on truck (water and dislodging) access to the camp and road conditions. ACTED stated they wouldn't be using the West gate access. ACTED got a compactor Thurs morning on site for repair works.
- **5.5** Oxfam, JEN and ACTED have devised a clear plan to agree on future maintenance works in the camp, the works are dived into three folds and would be shared with wider sector before the next meeting
- **5.6** Discussion of identifying a road that can be used that will not disturb residents of Zaatari of village and ensure security of water/wastewater trucks.
- **5.7** WASH block 108 in D03 was totally destroyed by refugees, beneficiaries in the area tried to protect it.
- **5.8** OXFAM put two temporary toilets in D08 to compensate for moving. Oxfam wants to start with the permanent toilets because more people are new arrivals are coming. Coordination with UNICEF at Amman level required.
- **5.9** JEN shared procedures and lessons learned from desludging stagnant water. Electricity contact with water was identified as a major challenge and JEN distributed screw drivers to WASH committees. Provided hotline number **(07 95694125 24hrs a day)**

- **5.10** Mohammed Ugool (UNICEF) to share ToR of new field team with partners this week. UNHCR to share ToR of field team with partners this week.
- **5.11** ACTED to contact Ahmad Alhamwan to fix a time to brief the teams this week.
- **5.12** ACTED and JEN to send contingency plans/resources for heavy rainfall events again, and provide staffing over Christmas
- **5.13** WASH Actors to explore further and come up with innovative ideas to disinfect the surface areas and explore the Jordanian regulations
- **5.14** ACTED to share final maintenance sheet organised by tiers to be shared before next meeting.
- **5.15** ACTED to provide update on discussion with Zaatari village representative, after accusations that trucks had ruined infrastructure in the village. Discuss responsibilities for

damages.

- **5.16** There is a need to identify a road that can be used that will not disturb residents of Zaatari of village and ensure security of water trucks
- **5.17** JEN to provide report on the wash block in D03.
- **5.18** UNICEF to follow up on OXFAM request to install two permanent toilets in D08.
