


Highlights

- On 26 January 2014, AFAD the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 214,668 including 111 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the period of 24-26 Jan 2014, a total of 1,167 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 1,029 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Karkamis camp, UNHCR was informed by the school manager of the camp that there are about 200 children of non-camp Syrians living in Karkamis town who are at school age but can not attend to any school as there are no Syrian schools in town like in other provinces. UNHCR will raise the issue with the local officials for possibility of their admission to the school in the camp if their transportation can be provided.
- In Hatay Yayladagi camps, the officials informed that 216 students enrolled to Turkish Language classes of TOMER (Turkish Language Learning Center). According to the school manager and camp officials, the number of students (248) who succeeded to pass the exams and have access to universities last year increased the motivation of several more to apply and their motivation of attendance to classes.
- In Adiyaman camp, the school manager informed that 3,291 children will receive their attendance certificates for the first semester of the education. The camp school will have 1-2 weeks of holiday. According to the official figures 56% of the camp population (9,975) are children of whom 60% are at school age and more than 90% of them are attending school in the camp.
- In Nizip-1 Camp, the officials informed that they are planning to establish 150 more showers (75 for men and 75 for women) in the camp. Reportedly land is allocated within the camp. It was also reported that a plot is allocated to build an oven which will be used by the camp residents.
- As planned before UNHCR's training for the camps' interpreters started as of 13 Jan 2014. During the week of 28 -31 Jan 2014, UNHCR staff conduct the training in Nizip-2 camp for the interpreters working in 3 camps (Nizip-1, Nizip-2 and Karkamis) of Gaziantep province.
