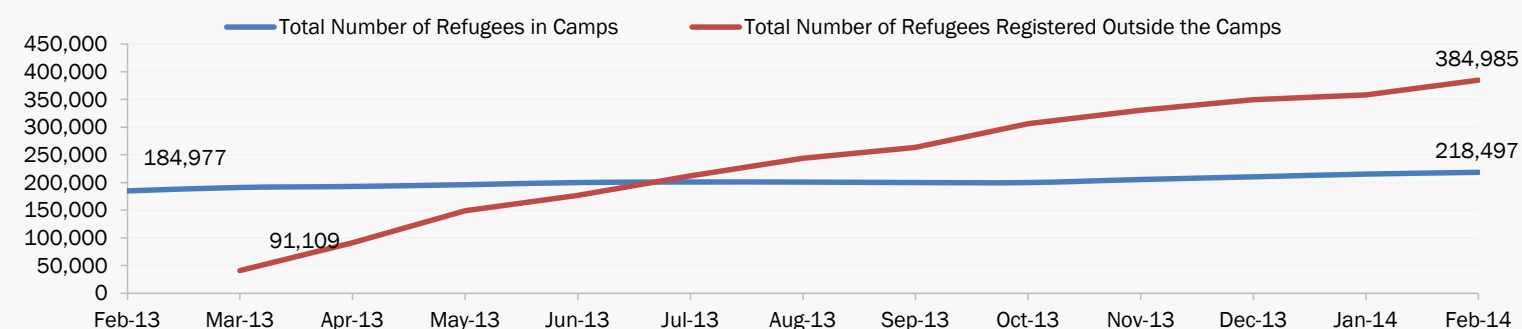

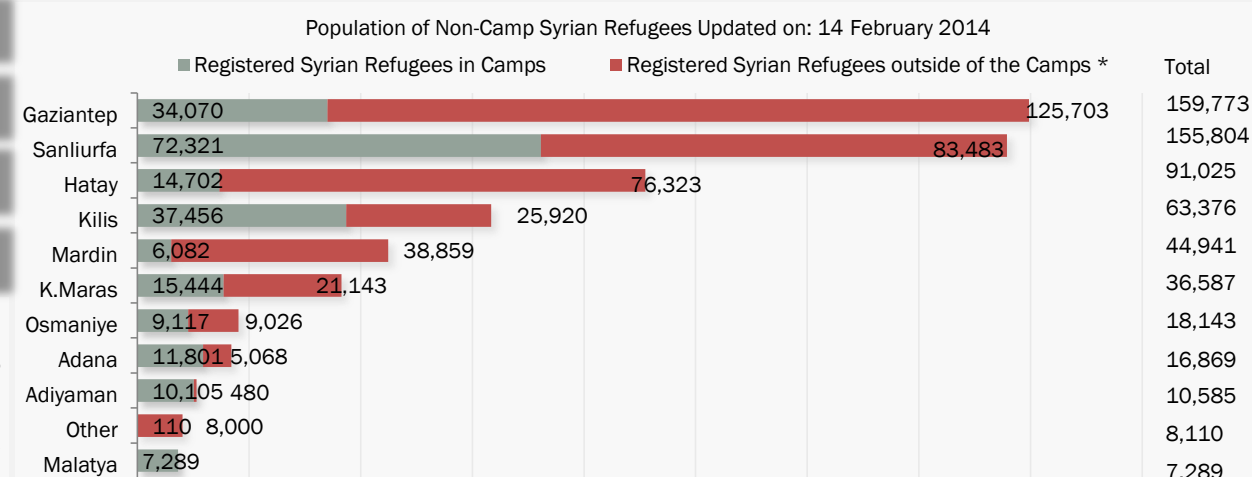

## Highlights

- On 16 February 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 218,497 including 110 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the period of 14-16 Feb 2014, a total of 957 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 888 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Kilis while the registration of non-camp Syrians is on-going, registration officials informed that as of 13 Feb 2014 about 22,000 Syrians have been registered, which is almost 85% of the total number of non-camp Syrians that were enumerated living in Kilis city center in 2013. In Kilis city center, UNHCR also observes that there is an increased number of Syrians in town which is confirmed by local community sources and NGOs working in the city.
- During a visit to Kilis, a UNHCR Team met with some newly arrived Syrians living in a warehouse which is reportedly rented and paid by an international NGO. Reportedly there are about 150 Syrians staying in this warehouse of whom some are new-arrivals. It was also reported by some of the Syrians that there are Syrians sleeping in various mosques at night while during the day, they go out to find work. In the outskirts of Kilis UNHCR Team observed Syrians having set up a makeshift camp, reportedly there are more than 1,000 Syrians living in about 280 makeshift tents. DRC made a quick assessment in this area for possible support.
- In Kilis Oncupinar container camp, the manager of the schools in the camp informed that upon request from the governorate IBC provided 7 Syrian teachers who will be working in pre-school/kindergarten classes. IBC will also provide snack boxes for the children (about 460) attending the pre-school and kindergarten classes.
- In Kilis Oncupinar camp, a Refugee Committee consisting of 9 members including 2 women is responsible for organizing cultural and social activities in the camp. The camp manager informed that the commission would like to implement a project to raise awareness among the camp residents on water consumption. They would like to reach out through the residents of 13-35 age group, to sensitize the people against wasting water. The camp management is supportive of the idea and UNHCR also offered the expertise of UNHCR WASH Officer to share ideas on how to sensitize the community.
