


Highlights

- On 18 February 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 218,530 including 109 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the period of 17-18 Feb 2014, a total of 53 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 88 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Viransehir the camp officials transferred 332 more people who are waiting in rub halls at the gate of the camp to Nusaybin camp. Reportedly there are still about more than 700 people at the gate of the camp because more people arrived in the last few days and all claimed to have crossed the borders from various locations including Hatay, and Kilis border line.
- It was reported in the media that artillery shells struck in the vicinity of the IDP camp in Bab Al Salame. Local people in Kilis reported that the sound was heard in the city center. UNHCR was informed by MFA Regional Representative in Gaziantep and reportedly the incident did not trigger any influx towards Turkey to Kilis borders. It was also reported by the local officials that Oncupinar Customs gate was closed for security reasons.
- Although local officials report that there is no major influx to the unofficial border crossing points, unofficial sources, local people stated that there are many people coming to Kilis everyday. This is also confirmed by the number of spontaneous arrivals in various towns and approach to the camps to be admitted. In Nizip, reportedly 300 Syrians are accommodated in mosques, and about 120 Syrians approached Adiyaman camp.
- A fire incident was reported in Osmaniye camp and four tents burned because of the misuse of electricity. No casualties were reported and the tents were replaced. The camp management is frequently raising awareness among the camp residents regarding fire hazards, however people are still using extra electrical outlets in the tents, especially hot plates to make bread.
- Clothes donated to children between 02-17 years have been delivered to all the camps in Gaziantep, Urfa, Adana, Kahramanmaraş, Osmaniye, Adiyaman. For the two camps in Mardin the delivery will take place next
