




Highlights

- On 20 February 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 219,388 including 116 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the period of 19-20 Feb 2014, a total of 880 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 313 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Hatay Yayladagi, the local officials informed that the registration of non-camp Syrians is on-going. The Syrians living outside the camps in Yayladagi town and its villages are provided transportation to the camp where the registration is taking place. The registration officials informed UNHCR that as of 19 Feb 2014, 834 families (more than 3,000 persons) have been registered.
- Spontaneous arrivals to the camps continued to be one of the major challenges for camp officials. The admissions of these spontaneous new arrivals is based on the availability of the space in the camp while priority is given to those who have immediate family members already registered in the camps. In Adiyaman camp officials informed that they are hosting 125 new arrivals in the waiting area of the camp and in Ceylanpinar during the week more than 350 new arrivals approached to the camp. The camp officials in Adiyaman are in contact with AFAD Hq. for the transfer of the new arrivals to other camps where space is available.
- In Akcakale, the camp officials informed that staff from Ministry of Family and Social Policies visited the camp and met with the women committee members. The ministry staff will provide a training on family planning and family economy to some selected members of the women's committee who later are expected to train the other members. The women's committee is expected to provide counseling to all the women in the camp on family planning and family economy.
