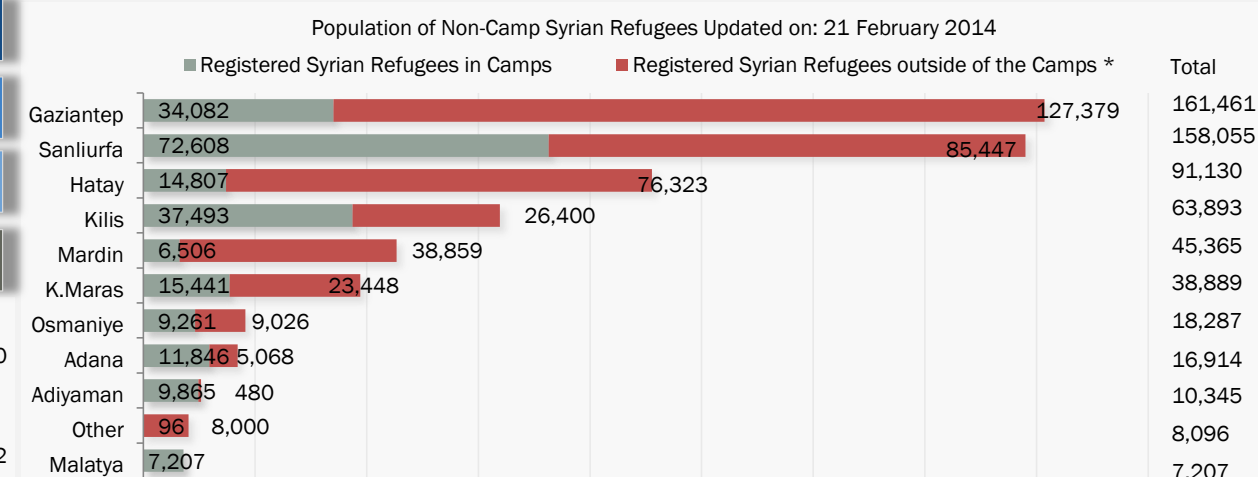
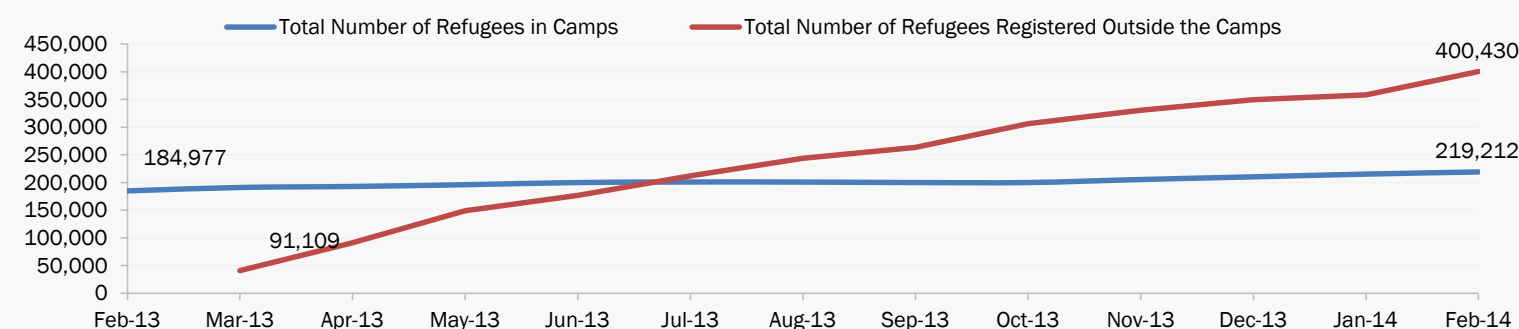
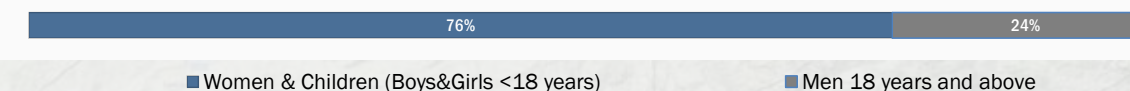

Highlights

- On 24 February 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 219,163 including 96 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the period of 23-24 Feb 2014, a total of 228 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 179 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- The Turkish NGO, IMPR informed UNHCR that in its community center in Sanliurfa city center it has already registered about 6,000 households of whom majority are from Deyr Ez-Zor. IMPR is considering to open another Community Center in another neighborhood in Sanliurfa city center. Through the community center IMPR does outreach work and provides language support to Syrians in their access to services (medical etc.), in the applications to police for temporary residence permit and also possible legal assistance through Bar Association. IMPR also reported to UNHCR that they are looking for the possibility of working in Mardin province city center or in Kiziltepe town.
- The registration of non-camp Syrians is on-going in Midyat camp, while another registration center was opened in the city center where only the emergency medical cases are registered and referred to hospital. So far, the new registration center opened as of mid Feb 2014 is not very much operational and has registered only few cases. Reportedly although the same software (AFIS) is used for registration, no ID cards are issued yet.
- UNHCR visited a school in Sanliurfa province which is facilitated by the Governorate. The school's capacity has just been increased, with 8 additional containers of which 6 were provided by a Turkish NGO while 2 were provided by AFAD. This additional space will not only increase the capacity of the school for more children but also the education days will be increased to 5 days per week with 2 shifts per day. There are already 18 volunteer teachers and another 8 will be starting to work after the 1st semester. It was also reported that although the teachers are working on a voluntary basis, a Syrian charity organization provided about 400 TL per teacher as an incentive.
