


Highlights

On 20 March 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 221,444. AFAD reported that during the period of 19-20 March 2014, a total of 1,197 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 621 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.


UNHCR Team met with an INGO named INSAN supported by Danish Government is providing psychosocial support in Narlica district of Antakya-Hatay to Syrian children between 04-12 years. According to the INGO, the Syrian Association enumerated some 13,800 non-camp Syrians living in Narlica district.

In Hatay Altinozu Boynuyogun camp, the officials informed UNHCR that although the camp is filled to capacity, they have admitted about 20 Syrians taking family reunification into consideration. According to the camp officials a Syrian businessman living in the Gulf has sent 100 TL per teacher and 20 TL per student, and was distributed to the beneficiaries. The camp management informed UNHCR that they are waiting for the computers to start computer classes.

In Sanliurfa Harran container camp, a UNHCR team visited the dental care center which is reportedly funded by a charity NGO from Kuwait. There are 2 Syrian doctors and 1 nurse working in the center and the staff informed UNHCR that the doctors are paid 500 USD per person per month and the nurse 250 USD.

In Kilis, an International NGO is providing prosthetic arms and legs to mostly war wounded Syrians. Reportedly about 25 beneficiaries are benefiting from the assistance. The same NGO is also providing assistance to the Syrians in Kilis through IMC. In Viransehir camp, officials informed that they have a committee of 2 physiotherapists, 7 rehabilitation staff and 2 support staff who jointly identify people in need in the camp and through IMC, they provide support items such as wheelchairs and walking sticks. Reportedly the beneficiaries who are provided these tools are also trained on how to use these properly.

In Nizip, the Head of Religious Affairs informed that they have identified about 2,800 Syrian families and are providing in kind assistance they receive through private donations.
