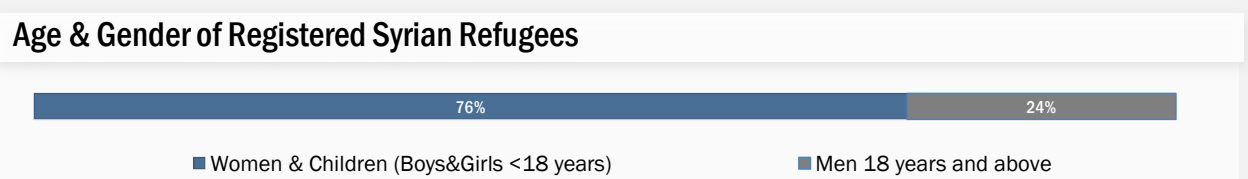
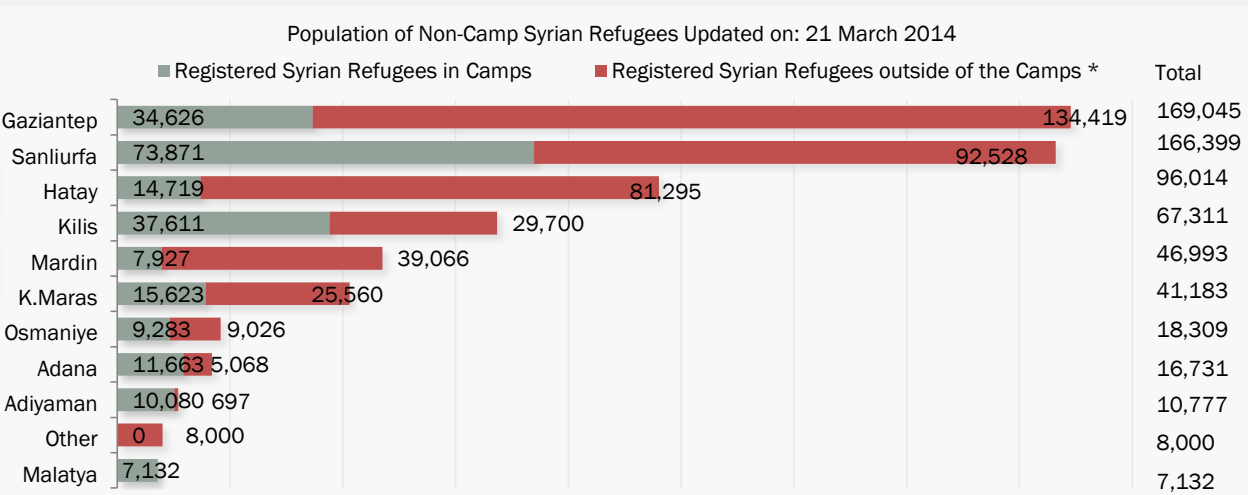
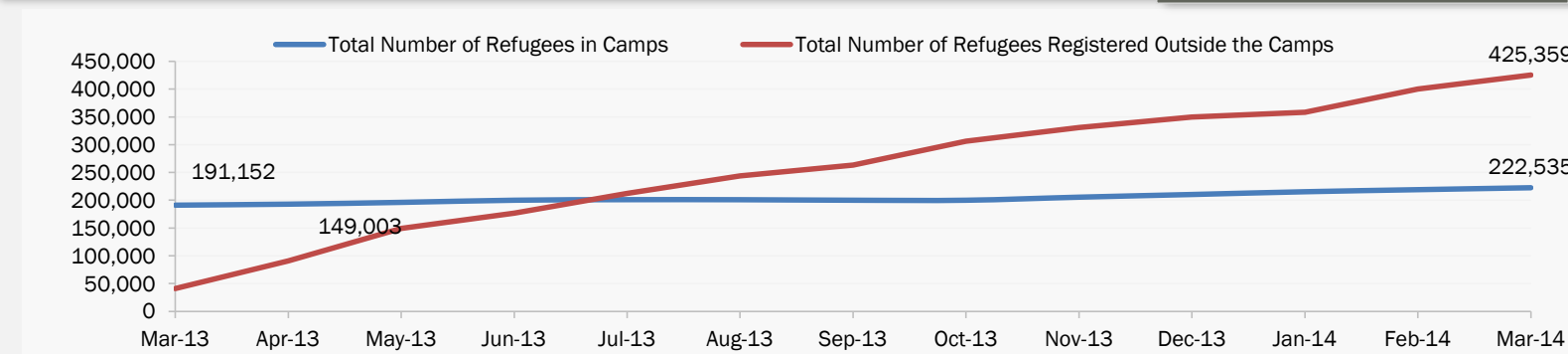

Highlights

- On 24 March 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 222,535. AFAD reported that during the period of 23-24 March 2014, a total of 857 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 342 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Adana, local officials informed that the mobile coordination center has started to register non-camp Syrians living in Adana province. The officials informed that so far about 130 non-camp Syrians have been registered and they are planning to increase the daily registration capacity up to 150 persons. Officials informed that 4 workstations are operational in the mobile center, however they have so far only 1 interpreter. According to the foreigners police more than 5,000 Syrians have been issued ikamets (temporary residence permit).
- In Mardin local officials informed UNHCR that the estimated total number of non-camp Syrians in Mardin province is about 50-60,000. Officials informed that AFAD had already registered about 39,000 Syrians and the police has recently opened the coordination center in Mardin city center and as of 23 March 2014 registered 2,538 non-camp Syrians. Due the reported high number of non-camp Syrians in Kiziltepe and Nusaybin towns, another center will be opened in Kiziltepe in 10 days and one is planned for Nusaybin.
- Local officials informed UNHCR that there are 2 schools for Syrian children in Kiziltepe as well as one in Mardin city center, one in Nusaybin and one in Midyat. Officials stated that the two schools in Kiziltepe have about 645 students, and some 281 students in Mardin city center. Local officials stated that there are about 30 Syrian teachers working in the schools and all 3 schools are supported by a national NGO. Officials informed that in Yesilli town of Mardin, there are about 21 Syrian children attending to Turkish schools as there are no Syrian schools in Yesilli town.
- In Sanliurfa, two schools in the city center are supported by a Syrian national NGO, that has provided desks, chairs, boards as well as various stationery supplies. Reportedly, the same NGO will also support a new school in Sanliurfa.
