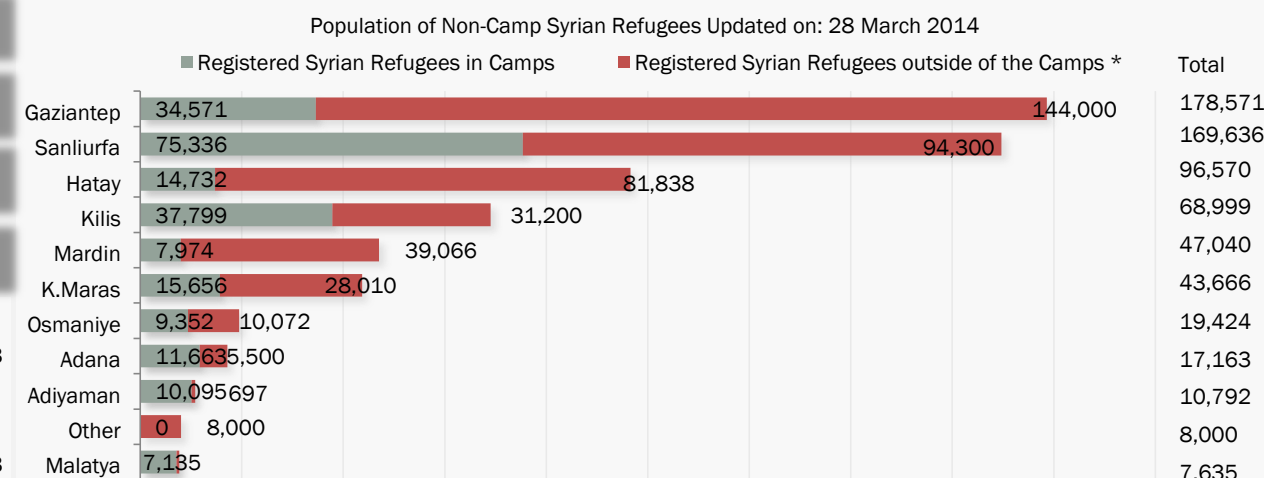
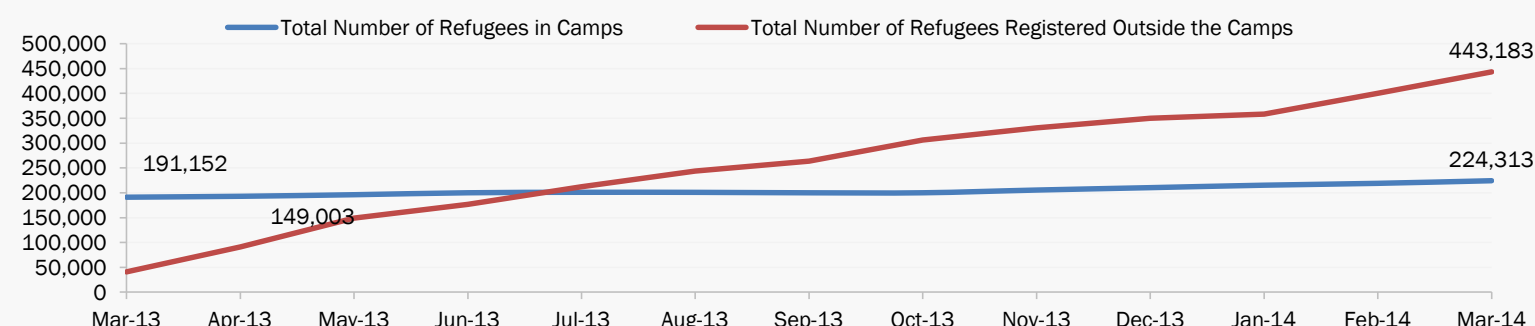


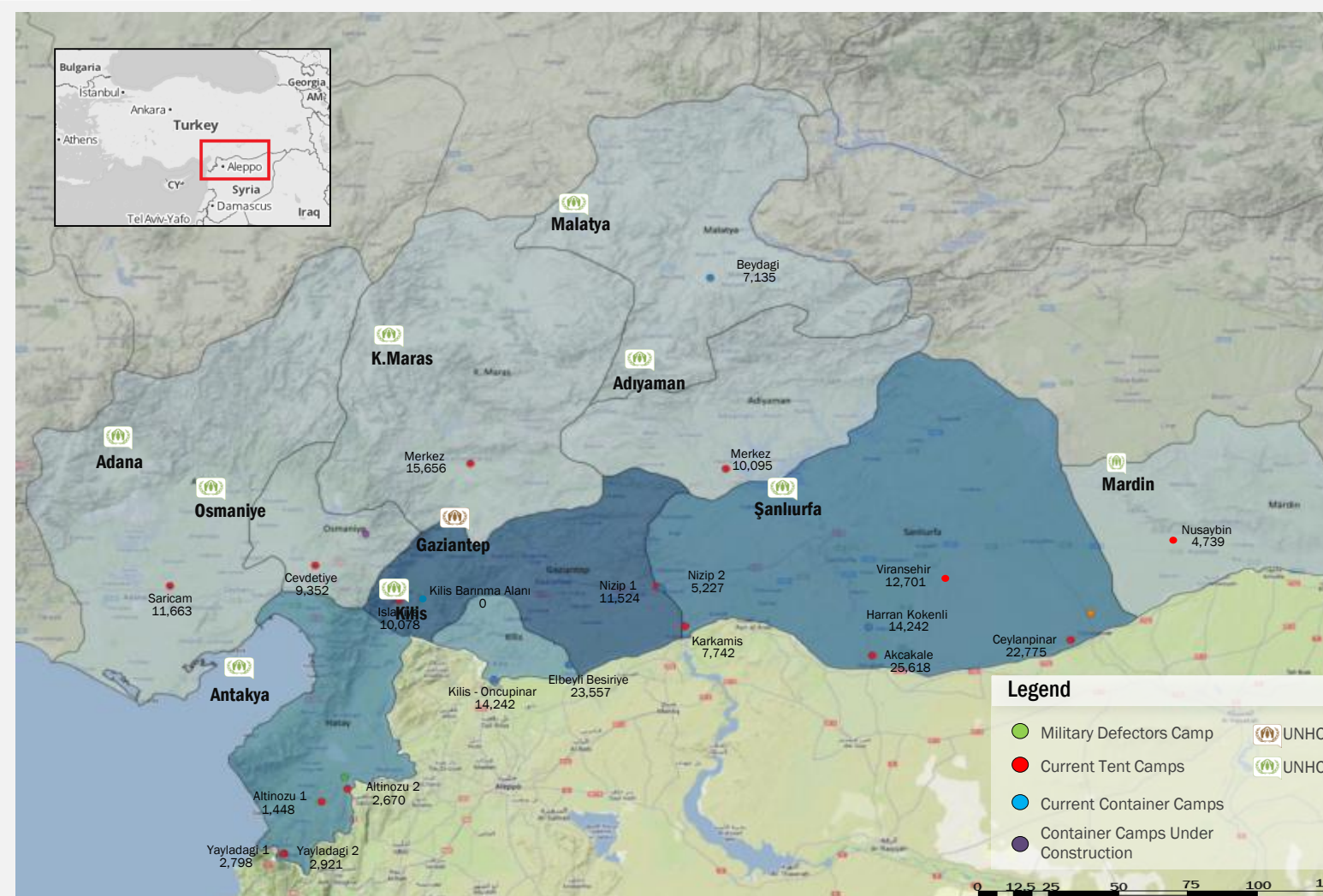

## Highlights

- On 31 March 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 224,313. AFAD reported that during the period of 30-31 March 2014, a total of 27 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 307 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- It was reported by the camp management in Adana (Saricam), Gaziantep (Nizip-1) and Adiyaman camp, that a strong storm affected several communal tents. In Adana some of the school tents were destroyed and education was temporarily suspended until the tents are re-replaced. In Adiyaman 2 communal tents for vocational course and 8 family tents were destroyed and are being replaced. In Nizip-2 also some communal tents were destroyed and those who were accommodated in these tents were moved to mosque tents.
- In Nizip-2 the camp management informed that they have registered those who were temporarily accommodated in the waiting area (546 persons) and issued their ID cards so people can benefit from medical assistance. In Karkamis about 168 people accommodated in the waiting area during the previous weeks are still waiting to be transferred to a camp. Both in Nizip-1 and Karkamis, those in the waiting area are provided hot meals and medical assistance when needed. In Adiyaman camp also about 125 persons temporarily accommodated in the waiting area waiting to be transferred to another camp.
- In Akcakale UNHCR visited some non-camp Syrians (12 families/ 60 persons) who are living in an empty government building formerly used as a prison. The families claimed that they came to Turkey during the clashes in Jan 2014 in Tel Abyad and do not want to be accommodated in a camp. The local authorities are aware of the group and informed that the families were offered to be placed in Viransehir camp but refused to be placed in a camp. The families informed UNHCR that they are assisted by the local community and some NGOs. UNHCR is following up with its partners to explore different ways to assist the families.
