



- On 02 April 2014, AFAD the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 224,453. AFAD reported that during the period of 01-02 April 2014, a total of 412 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 332 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- The 12 mobile registration centers that have been deployed to the field are currently located in Sanliurfa (1 in Sanliurfa centre and 1 in Akcakale border gate), Hatay (1 in Reyhanli, 1 in Kirikhan), Gaziantep (1 in Islahiye, 1 to be deployed to Nizip), Osmaniye (1), Batman (1), Kahramanmaras (1), Adana (1), and Kilis (2).
- Of these 12 mobile registration centers, UNHCR has noted that 8 are operational, specifically in Hatay (1 in Reyhanli and 1 in Kirikhan), Kilis (2 in the city centre), Osmaniye (cite centre), Adana, Gaziantep (Islahiye), and Sanliurfa (Akcakale border). In Adana UNHCR team visited the mobile coordination center which has been activated during last week, where so far 1,168 persons have been registered. The officials expect to register more than 100 persons per day.
- In Gaziantep, there are more than 1,000 Syrians who are temporarily accommodated in the communal tents in Nizip-1, Karkamis and Islahiye camps, while in Adiyaman another 140 persons are waiting to be transferred to another camp, presumably Nusaybin or Viransehir. The majority of these 1,000 people in Gaziantep camps were referred by provincial AFAD officials as they have been living in dire conditions in Gaziantep while others (including those in Adiyaman) approached the camps spontaneously as they had no place to stay. UNHCR was informed that that on 03 April 2014, about 250 Syrians from Islahiye camp have been transferred to Nusaybin camp.
- In Akcakale camp, the public health unit staff informed UNHCR that the Ministry of Health will soon be giving training on reproductive health to women in the camp. Upon suggestion from the UNHCR team a session on Sexually Transmitted Diseases (STD) will als be included in the training.
