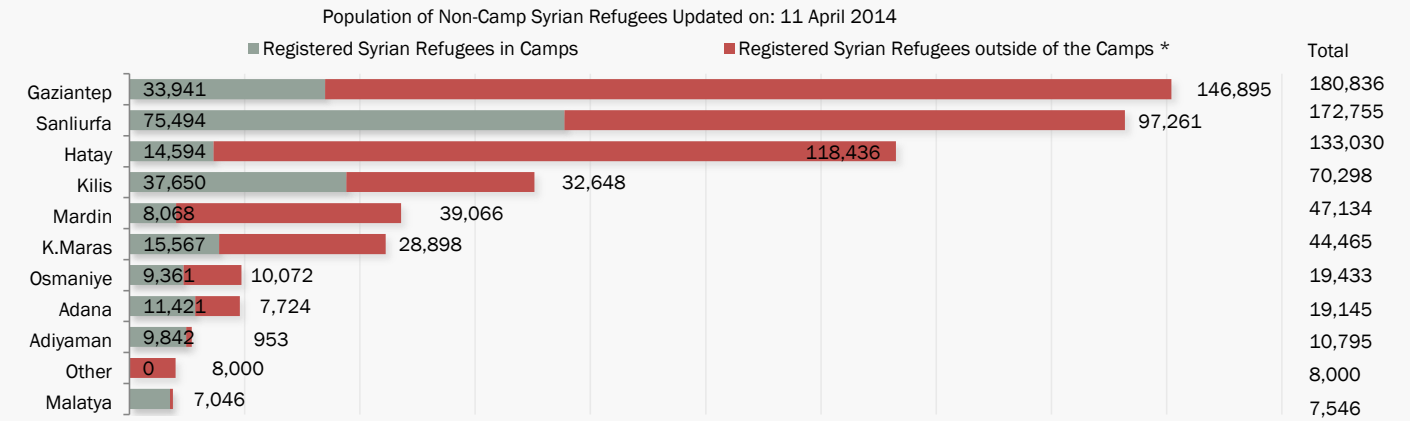
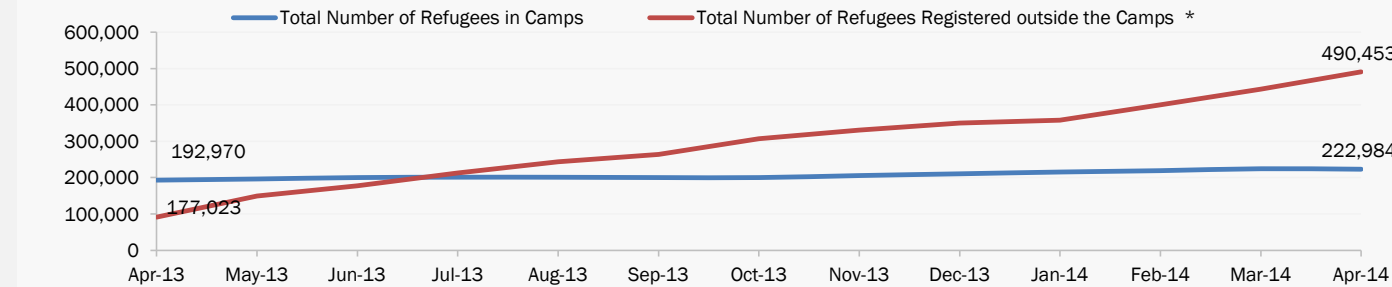

Highlights

- On 13 April 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 222,912. AFAD reported that during the period of 09-13 April 2014, a total of 849 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 1,539 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- UNHCR provided two-day workshops to all provincial directors of AFAD during 07-12 April 2014. The training's focus was mainly on Camp Management and Camp Coordination, and included modules on International Protection, Standards and Camp Set up, Care & Maintenance, Information Management, Camp Closure etc. 81 Directors participated in the training in two groups.
- Provincial Director of AFAD in Istanbul informed that they have so far enumerated about 57,880 Syrians living in private accommodations in Istanbul of which 669 people are settled in two communal centers (guesthouses) in Pendik and Tuzla districts. AFAD is providing food to those in the guesthouses and in coordination with AFAD Ankara, it is planning to transfer them to camps in southeast where space is available.
- During the training of the AFAD Directors, UNHCR was informed that around 115,000 Syrians have been enumerated in various cities; Mersin, Konya, Batman, Siirt and Istanbul. Reportedly the vast majority of Syrians are not yet registered in the respective cities while some 20,000 are reportedly issued ikamets (temporary residence permit) in Mersin.
- The number of Syrians in the waiting area in Karkamis camp increased to about 235 persons during last week. The camp officials informed UNHCR that they are waiting for instructions from AFAD Hq to transfer these people to a camp where space is available. In the mean time last week 349 Syrians who were temporarily accommodated in the waiting area in Nizip-1 camp have been transferred to Nusaybin camp; however they refused to get off the bus in Nusaybin and were brought back to Nizip. A UNHCR Team was present when the officials counseled the people and will follow up with the officials who are seeking a solution for them.
