



Sector highlights from April

WASH:

- Distribution of **3,800M³ of water** is ongoing every day (06:00-18:00)
- De-sludging of **1,700M³ of wastewater** is ongoing everyday
- The handover of WASH facilities to WASH committees is on-going, **295/ 417** have been handed-over so far.
- On 5 June ACTED/JEN & Oxfam have a monthly cleaning campaign across various districts in the camp with preparation throughout May

PROTECTION:

Verification update (7 May):

- The verification exercise that started on 27 January 2014 has so far registered **72,780 individuals**
- **65,373 are active** and 7,407 have been totally inactivated
- 4,431 individuals are on hold
- **57.5%** of the active individuals are children
- **12,946 (19.8%)** are under 5 years old

NON-FOOD ITEMS (NFIs):

- The following items were distributed in April: TOMS summer shoes, diapers.
- The following items are planned for May: soap and sanitary napkins.

SHELTER:

- **159 caravans** were distributed between 20-26 April. In April 2014 a total of **558 caravans** were distributed in Zaatari. Since the beginning of 2014, **a total of 5,839 caravans** have been distributed.
- UNHCR Field Unit staff continue to carry out caravan distributions with the support of IRD, NRC and the Jordanian police, however this will slow-down in May to allow for verification of existing caravans.

HEALTH:

- The new Saudi clinic in district 5 will open in May.
- The JHAS clinic on market street is no longer operational 24 hours, closing at 4pm every day.
- IRD started an awareness campaign on personal hygiene with information available in the Zaatari kitchens.
- A recent nutrition survey conducted in the camp revealed very low levels of malnutrition.

EDUCATION:

- **12,000 students** are attending school in Zaatari.
- **250 children** have been trained in Taekwondo in Zaatari

FOOD:

- WFP and Save the Children have finished monthly in-kind food distribution cycles and have shifted to food vouchers only. Vouchers are distributed twice a month with a value of 10 JD.
- School feeding programme is on-going in Zaatari's 3 schools with distribution to **11,754 children**
- WFP and partners will soon start supplementary feeding for lactating mothers and children under five.
- Daily distribution of **21.2 MT of bread** is on-going.

New arrivals and registration update

Statistics from reporting period 27 April – 3 May 2014

- **2,593 individuals processed** in Rab'a Al-Sahan during the reporting period.
- **90% new arrival and 10% re-entry**
- **53% are minors**
- **93% entered to Jordan through Eastern border crossings** (Ruwaished-Hadallat). Jaber (Nassib) unofficial, Altura - Tal Shihab and Matwie are the next entry points, all with less than 1%. For 4.3% of the registered cases, no data is available.
- **Area of origin in Syria:**
 - 32.2% from Dar'a
 - 19.2% from Aleppo
 - 12.5% from Homs
 - 10.6% from rural Damascus
- During this period, **1,744 people were transferred to Azraq** and the rest transported to Zaatari.
- Birth certificates: **768** (including 273 from the waiver list)
- **561 government organised returns** (27 April-3 May)
- In April, **996 were granted a leave permit** (1-10 days) and 542 were granted bail out or travelled abroad
