

## AVSI Foundation

### Mission

**AVSI** The Association of Volunteers in International Service is an international not-for-profit, non-governmental organization (NGO) established in Italy in 1972. AVSI mission is to support human development in developing countries with special attention to education and the promotion of the dignity of every human person. AVSI carries out its mission through the planning and implementation of medium and long-term sustainable projects and emergency relief operations in partnership with local associations, institutions, governments, and international agencies. Presently, the global AVSI Network links together over 60 organizations, most of which are local institutions in non-western countries. At present, AVSI is operating in 38 countries of Africa, Latin America, Eastern Europe, the Middle East, and Asia with over 130 long term projects and relief operations directly benefiting around 4,000,000 people in various sectors (socio-education, urban development, healthcare, work, agriculture, food security and water, energy and environment, humanitarian emergencies and migration). Highly qualified AVSI personnel is directly involved in long-term field assignments together with hundreds of locally hired people and supported by dozens of academics and senior practitioners. Financial support is secured through numerous grants and donations of private individuals, associations, and businesses which thereby practice and invest in global solidarity.

#### PROTECTION SECTOR

**Objective 2:** Community empowerment, engagement, outreach and self-reliance is strengthened and expanded, and WGBM are engaged in the planning, implementation & evaluation of services.

Output 2.5 Psychosocial support services are strengthened and expanded **USD 620,000**

**Objective 4:** Emergency child protection interventions for boys and girls are strengthened & harmonized.

Output 4.1 Capacity development and collaboration with relevant stakeholders is strengthened, including through the mainstreaming of child protection into other humanitarian response sectors. **USD 56,200**

Output 4.2 CP prevention activities are increased, including through the strengthening of CBCPCs and other community structure **USD 40,000**

#### EDUCATION SECTOR

**Objective 1:** Children and youth have sustained access to appropriate education opportunities.

Output 1.2 Out of school boys and girls including adolescents and youth (6-24 years) benefit from alternative education services such as informal, non-formal education, and basic life skills activities. **USD 300,000**

### NFI SECTOR

**Objective 1:** Ensure that the basic HH needs of MWBG are met.

Output 1.2 Provision of basic HH items to mitigate harsh weather conditions **USD 262,840**

### CASH SECTOR

**Objective 1:** Ensure that the needs of extremely vulnerable SYR as well as JOR affected by the refugee crisis are covered across Jordan.

Output 1.3 Provision of equitable seasonal assistance **USD 300,758**

## Additional Sector Information

AVSI in Jordan has already worked to support people affected by the Syrian conflict, with two winterization intervention during winter in 2013 and 2014, characterized by NFIs distribution in the host communities in Irbid, Mafraq, Zarqa, Madaba and Amman. AVSI has implemented other projects to support Syrian refugees in Irbid in 2012 in the education sector, through informal education and remedial classes for children and youth.

## Geographic Focus

AVSI in Jordan has intervened in support of Iraqi refugees, Palestinian people and local communities in the governorates of Jarash, Irbid, Amman, Ajloun and Zarqa.

The support for Jordanians in host communities through educational activities is continuing in Zarqa and Ajloun.

In 2014 AVSI is intervening in support of Syrian refugees in the governorates of Zarqa, Madaba, Aqaba and is planning to expand its activities in Mafraq and Irbid.
