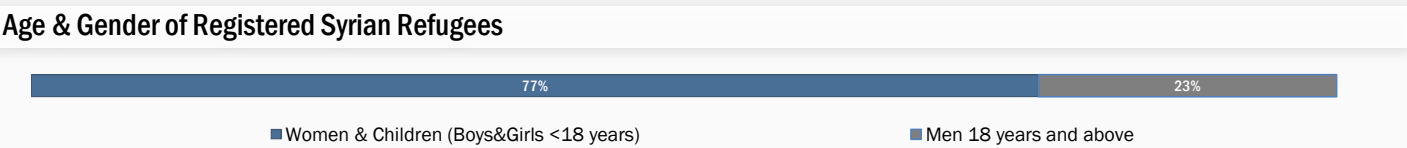
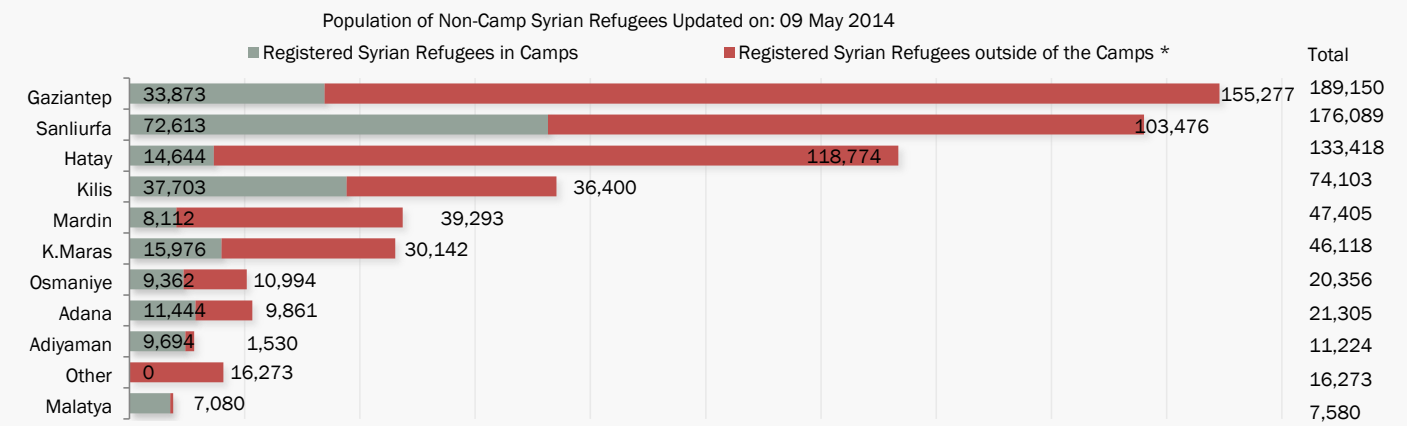
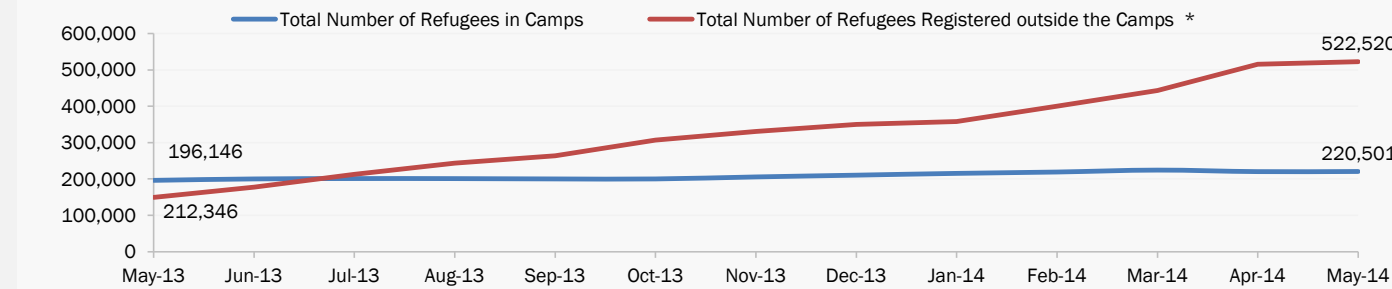

Highlights

- On 12 May 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 220,501. AFAD reported that during the period of 11-12 May 2014, a total of 418 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 213 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- During the camp visit on Monday, UNHCR team observed the arrival of 94 Syrians transferred from Ceylanpinar camp. The camp officials informed these people had spontaneously approached Ceylanpinar during the previous days and had been temporarily accommodated in the waiting area. Nusaybin camp officials stated that the transfer of the group was done following an instruction from AFAD Hq. In addition they have also been informed about the planned transfer of about 50 persons from Viransehir.
- In Nusaybin, out of 94 people transferred from Ceylanpinar, only 56 Syrians got off the bus upon arrival. These were admitted and registered in the camp while the others refused to stay in Nusaybin and returned to Ceylanpinar as they claimed to have relatives in Ceylanpinar camp. UNHCR Team talked to some of the new arrivals, 43 of whom claimed to have relatives in the camp. They stated to be from Aleppo and crossed to Turkey from Kilis border recently through informal crossing points.
- In Adana, registration staff informed UNHCR that they continue to register non-camp Syrians in the Mobile coordination center. Reportedly about 100-150 persons are registered on a daily basis and another 100-150 persons are given appointments for registration. The officials informed the number of people given appointments is more than 20,000 and appointments are given up to early Feb. 2015. The officials announced that as of Monday, 12 May more than 4,500 non-camp Syrians have been registered in Adana.
- In Adana the officials informed that non-camp Syrians are mostly living in Seyhan and Yuregir districts due to working opportunities in agriculture fields as well as some textile business. The sub-governorate of Yuregir informed that due to the limited sources, based on the individual request from the families, they provide food packages to some vulnerable families based on the house visit assessment conducted by SASF (Social Assistance and Solidarity Foundation) staff.
