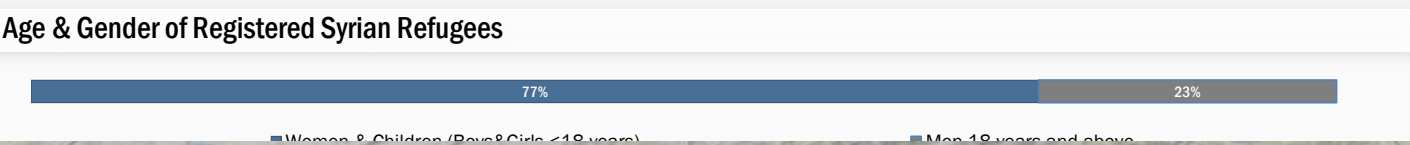
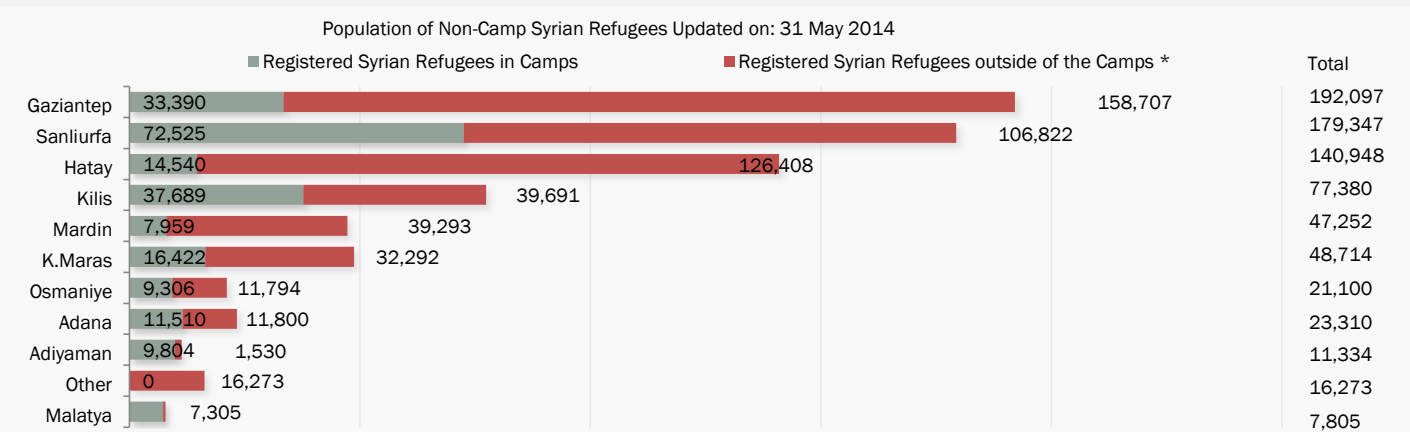
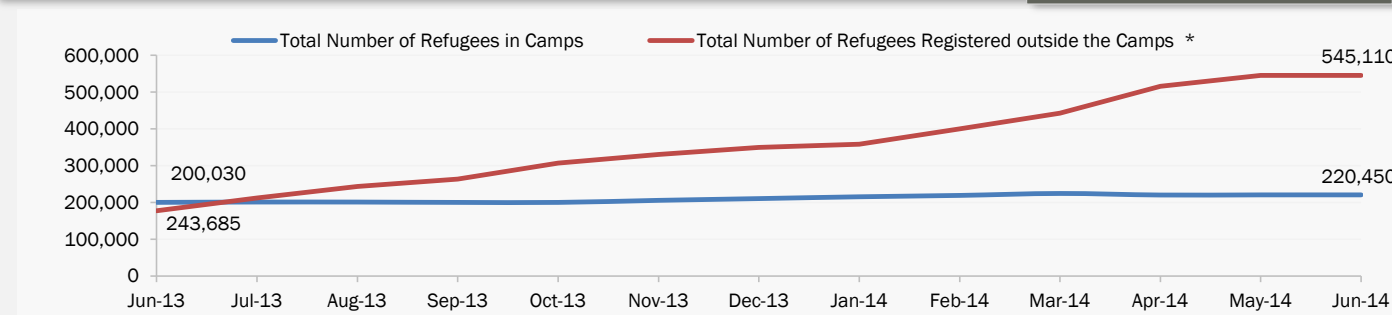

Highlights

- On 01 June 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 220,450.
- AFAD reported that on 30 May 2014, a total of 16 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 19 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- Local officials in Hatay/Reyhanli informed UNHCR that the number of non-camp Syrians registered in Reyhanli reached more than 40,000 as of the end of May 2014. Officials also informed UNHCR that they have started to distribute ID Cards. The registration is reportedly ongoing, however the majority of those enumerated have already been registered. Newcomers will now be registered through the Mobile Coordination Center.
- The UNHCR-funded Multi Service Center, which will be implemented by ASAM and IMC (an NGO), opened on 02 June 2014. The center has qualified social services staff, community workers, psychologists and heal workers/nurses. The center also includes a child friendly space, and classes for language courses etc. In addition to psychosocial counseling, the Center will provide Syrians with information on access to available services and their rights.
- In Mardin Midyat camp, in response to a request from camp officials and observations by UNHCR Field, UNHCR has provided a braille typewriter with a sufficient amount of ● In Akcakale, officials informed UNHCR that the border gate is officially closed for security reasons. However, officials indicated that during the last week of May 2014, they facilitated the safe return of approximately 600 Syrians who had approached the gate requesting voluntary return to Syria.
- Some national and international NGOs informed UNHCR that they are planning to distribute hygiene kits to non-camp Syrians in the rural areas of Harran and Akcakale towns. Distribution has already started in some areas, while the NGOs are still discussing modalities of distribution with local authorities in others.
