



Highlights

- On 09 June 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 219,484. AFAD reported that during the period of 08-09 June 2014, a total of 278 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 661 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- Viransehir camp officials informed UNHCR that, upon request from AFAD Ankara, they have identified people with special needs. As per instruction from AFAD Ankara, 11 people with special needs (PSN) were sent to the camp in Malatya. Officials reported that another 19 people will also be sent to Malatya camp due to their vulnerability.
- In Midyat camp, officials informed UNHCR that the educational semester ended during the first week of June, and that baccalaureate exams are taking place from 10 to 28 June. It is reported that the Syrian Education Commission sent tests to the camp for the examination period.
- In Kilis Oncupinar container site, the camp management is planning to organize Turkish language classes during the summer school holiday period for the Syrian volunteer teachers working at the school. Camp officials informed UNHCR that they are in contact with the provincial directorate of Ministry of National Education to assign the Turkish teachers who will provide the language classes.
- In Viransehir camp, officials informed UNHCR that 160 of the 344 Syrians who were transferred to the camp from Istanbul during the previous week have, with permission, left the camp. Officials informed UNHCR that most of these Syrians stated they wanted to go back to Istanbul and did not intend to return to the camp because they have been living in Istanbul and want to remain there.
- In Adana, local authorities reported that in 2013 about 128,000 beneficiaries received medical assistance, with another 34,000 beneficiaries receiving medical assistance in the first two months of 2014. Officials stated that Adana province has spent more than 13 million TL on these services during that time.
