



Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	805,308

Highlights

- On 14 July 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 220,001. AFAD reported that during the period of 13-14 July 2014, a total of 84 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 118 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Viransehir camp, officials informed UNHCR that, for the month of Ramadan, the camp management is organizing iftars (fast-breaking dinners) two to three times per week inviting the camp residents in groups up to 500-700 in each time. Local officials, including the sub-governor, participate in these dinners. The priority for attendance is given to vulnerable groups such as female headed households, disabled people and separated children. Members of the committees and the camp district mukhtars are also invited to these dinners.
- In Kilis, a social worker from the provincial AFAD directorate informed UNHCR that they are conducting a vulnerability assessment of the cases that are referred to them by the INGOs and NGOs in the city. An AFAD social worker informed that, upon request and in response to strong advocacy, the provincial directorate of Ministry of Family and Social Policies also assigned social workers to work with AFAD during the assessments.
- In Siverek town of Sanliurfa, local officials informed UNHCR that they have 978 families of non-camp Syrians (approx. 4,000 persons) registered or enumerated in the town. Officials from SASF (Social Assistance and Solidarity Foundation) in Siverek town informed that they have provided food packages to about 300 vulnerable families so far and are planning a third distribution round. Officials stated that they are aiming to reach about 400 families in the third distribution round, however, depending on the need, they can provide packages for up to 1,000 families.
- In Kumlu town of Hatay, a UNHCR team met with a school that is run by the Syrian community and supported by an INGO. The school manager informed UNHCR that about 400 children of non-camp Syrians are attending the classes between 1st and 9th grade, and that the volunteer teachers are also paid about 200 USD as incentive funding by the supporting INGO. Local authorities reported that about 2,300 non-camp Syrians are registered in Kumlu.
