



Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	<b>804,391</b>

## Highlights

- On 17 July 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 219,084. AFAD reported that during the period of 16-17 July 2014, a total of 58 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 269 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- A UNHCR Field Team visited the local officials in Reyhanli and was informed that the number non-camp Syrians registered in Reyhanli is 43,131, of whom almost 86% are residing in Reyhanli town center while the rest are in the villages of Reyhanli. Local officials informed UNHCR that, as they believe that they have completed the registration of all the non-camp Syrians in town, the mobile coordination center was transferred to Gaziantep, however they are preparing one of the office rooms in the police department to register any new refugees that arrive in Reyhanli.
- A UNHCR Team visited officials in Besni town of Adiyaman. The local officials reported that the registration of non-camp Syrians is only done in the city center, however they have enumerated about 60 households (approx.: 500 persons) and are keeping their basic bio data and contacts in their local database. The police indicated that they are conducting regular house visits to follow up and update their data. Reportedly, the majority of these non-camp Syrians are registered with the police in Adiyaman and those who are not registered are referred to the coordination center to be registered.
- In Besni town of Adiyaman a local NGOs provided space to a group of locals who have self-initiated a platform to support the Syrian refugees in the town. The group prepared some flyers to raise awareness and to support the Syrians. They are conducting house visits to assess the vulnerability of the Syrian families and their needs and, depending on the need, they provide NFIs such as second hand house goods and food packages through the local donations they receive. The platform members are also advocating with the local authorities to register the children of the non-camp Syrian families in the Turkish schools.
- In Ceylanpinar town, Turkish Red Crescent informed that they have received 1,077 food packages from Welt Hunger Hilfe (WHH) and will start to distribute them to the non-camp Syrians in Ceylanpinar town during the coming week, and that they will complete the distribution before the Eid Holiday.
