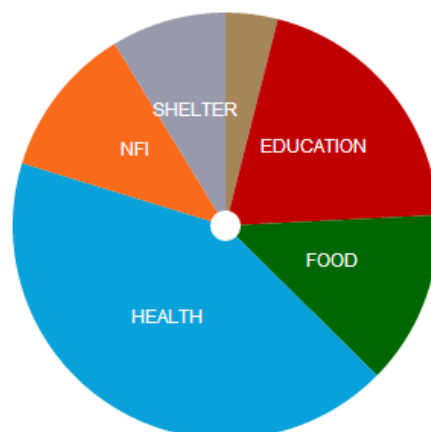
## Caritas Jordan

#### **SHELTER SECTOR**

**Objective 1:** Provide adequate shelter for vulnerable Syrians (WGBM) and targeted members of the host community in urban / rural settings outside of camps .

Output 1.1 Housing units upgraded to a minimum standard .	USD 400,000

### FOOD SECURITY SECTOR SECTOR

**Objective 1:** Maintain food security and improve food availability, access and utilization for Syrian refugees in Jordan through appropriate and consistent food assistance.

Output 1.2 Syrian refugees received cash, vouchers or other forms of food assistance in urban and rural areas including vulnerable Syrian refugees awaiting UNHCR registration **USD 965,819**

**Objective 2:** Improve food security including food availability, access and utilization for vulnerable Jordanian populations through targeted food production and livelihood intervention.

Output 2.1 Vulnerable Jordanian families living in areas with high concentration of Syrian refugees received food assistance. **USD 363,982**

**Objective 3:** Improve the nutritional status of Syrian refugees, particularly malnourished girls and boys under the age of five and pregnant and lactating women.

Output 3.1 Nutritional habits of Syrian women, girls, boys and men have improved through healthy behavior training, communication and sensitization. **USD 0**

**Objective 4:** Ensure effective and coordinated sectorial response through evidence-based food security and livelihood interventions.

### **HEALTH SECTOR**

**Objective 2:** Improve equitable access, quality and coverage to essential secondary and tertiary health care for Syrian refugee women, girls, boys and men in Jordan by end of 2014.

Output 2.1 Referral system for secondary and tertiary care established **USD 800,000**

**Objective 3:** Support the capacity of the national health care system to provide services to Syrian women, girls, boys and men and vulnerable Jordanians in the most affected governorates by the end of 2014.

Output 3.1 Access to primary and essential secondary and tertiary health care supported. **USD 6,000,000**
