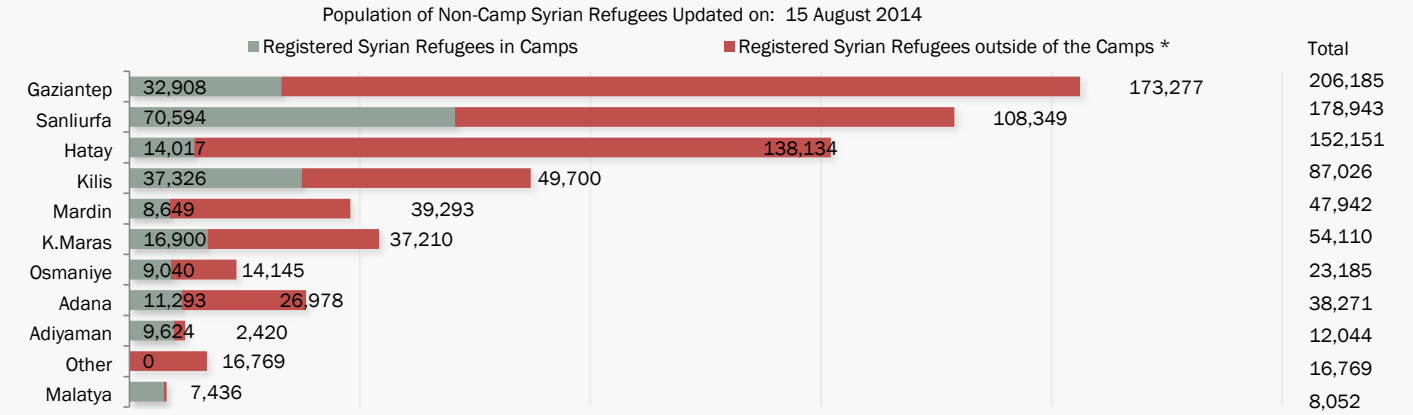
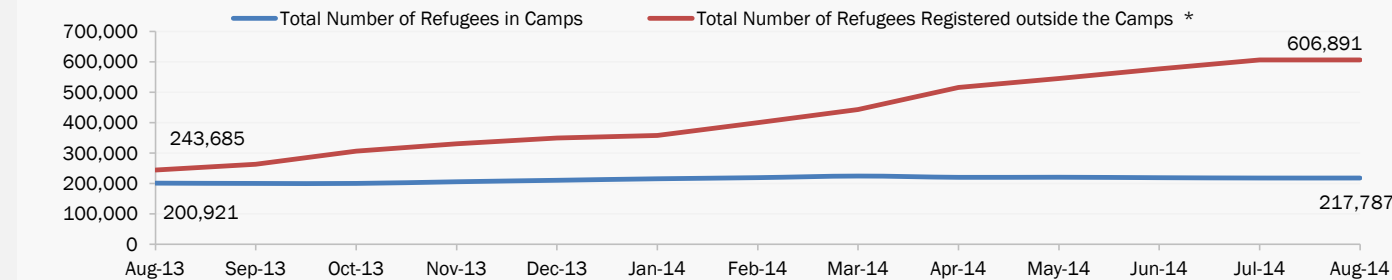
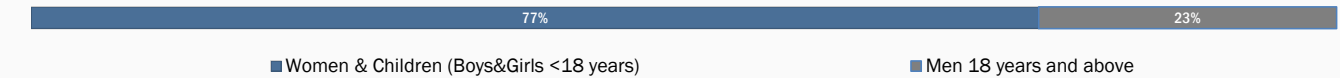

Highlights

- On 18 August, AFAD, the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Turkey's Government, announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in the 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 217,787. AFAD reported that from 17 to 18 August, a total of 318 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 94 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Adana, local officials informed that they have established a help desk in the state hospital where Arabic speaking staff is assigned to provide support to the Syrian patients. A UNHCR team met with the officials and was informed that on a daily basis they receive around 350-400 Syrian patients, which represents 8% of the overall number of daily patients of the hospital.
- Viransehir camp officials informed that around 380 Syrians (all families) were sent to the camp from Gaziantep during the weekend. Reportedly these families were either living in destitute conditions, or some were begging in the streets and found to be disturbing the public order. Some were also reportedly picked up by police from the street or from their residence and sent to the camps.
- Viransehir camp officials informed that upon arrival on the camp, around 40 Syrians requested to be returned to Syria. Later on, after being registered and accommodated in their family tents, most of them changed their minds. Among the group there was a family who were not given an opportunity to collect their belongings during the tensions, but eventually the family was given permission to go to Gaziantep and retrieve their possessions.
- A UNHCR team visited the school in Sirrin district of Sanliurfa province for non-camp Syrians in Sanliurfa. The school was initially managed by the Governorate but handed over to provincial directorate of Education. The school manager informed UNHCR about a new school donated by UNICEF with 12 classrooms in Yenice District. It is to be opened mid Sept for the new academic year. The school is intended to providing education from 1st to 4th grade, in two shifts per day. The education department is working on identification of Syrian teachers and applications have already been received.
