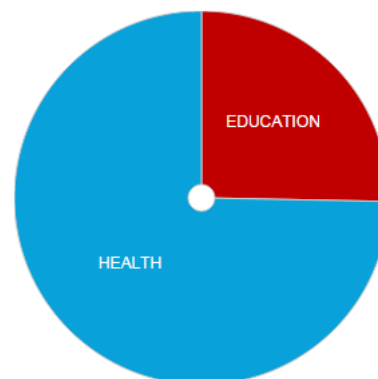
## International Relief & Development (IRD)



### Mission

IRD is a nonprofit, nongovernmental organization responsible for implementing relief, stabilization, and development programs worldwide. Our mission is to reduce the suffering of the world's most vulnerable groups and provide the tools and resources needed to increase their self-sufficiency. Specializing in meeting the needs of communities emerging from conflict or natural disaster, IRD collaborates with a wide range of partners and donors, local organizations, and many others to deliver sustainable services. IRD has offices and activities in nearly 40 countries in Europe and Asia, the Middle East, Africa, the Americas, and Asia and the Pacific. We work in seven key service areas: community stabilization, infrastructure, health, agriculture, democracy and governance, relief, and logistics.

Since 2006, IRD Jordan has been implementing programs to support Syrian refugees and to construct and improve community support for public schools. It is also working in close contact with the Ministry of Health to deliver health projects.

**Objective 2:** Improve equitable access, quality and coverage to essential secondary and tertiary health care for Syrian refugee women, girls, boys and men in Jordan by the end of 2014.

Output 2.1 Referral system for secondary and tertiary care established **USD 274,900**

**Objective 4:** Improve coverage of comprehensive health and rehabilitation services to Syrian refugees through integrated community level interventions by end of 2014.

Output 4.2 Community level referral system in place **USD 1,200,000**

#### EDUCATION SECTOR

**Objective 1:** Children and youth have sustained access to appropriate education opportunities.

Output 1.1 School aged Syrian boys and girls benefit from formal education (primary and secondary) **USD 500,000**

### Additional Sector Information

IRD is supporting 26 Ministry of Health centers to meet the needs of Syrian refugees and affected communities through home-based vulnerability assessments, health education, and referrals. The program is also strengthening community response to domestic and gender-based violence, as well as procuring new diagnostic and laboratory equipment to help health providers institute more efficient diagnostic and assessment processes. IRD and the Ministry of Education are partnering on this five-year project designed to complement the Jordan School Reconstruction Project, which renovates and builds new schools across the country, and USAID's Education Reform Support Program, which provides state-of-the-art school-based training to maximize the impact of the new space.

## **Geographic Focus**

In Jordan in 2014, IRD is implementing interventions countrywide in the governorates of Amman, Irbid, Mafraq, Balqa, Zarqa, Jarash, Ajloun, Tafila, Maan, Madaba and Aqabah. It will also intervene in Zaatari Refugee Camp, CyberCity Refugee Camp, and King Abdullah Park.
