



### KEY ACHIEVEMENT OF THE MONTH

**26,250** persons (**5,250** families)  
received newcomer NFI kits.

### HIGHLIGHTS:

The sector distributed NFI newcomer kits to 26,250 persons (5,250 families). A standard kit consists of one blanket and one mattress per person, amounting to an average of 5 blankets and 5 mattresses per family/kit, one kitchen set and one hygiene kit per family.

Baby kits are also included for families with a children under 2 years of age.

Approximately USD 240,000 were distributed in cash assistance for multiple purposes to 1,370 vulnerable families.

### NEEDS ANALYSIS:


In order to mitigate the adverse effects of displacement and to address the needs for survival, humanitarian agencies provided identified beneficiary households with Core Relief Items (CRI), which included newcomer kits and winterization assistance. At a later stage, assistance using the cash transfer modality was used to respond to the multiple needs of refugees. This modality aims at empowering beneficiaries to be able to prioritise their own expenditure needs.

The sector is currently moving towards a multipurpose cash programme targeting those identified as the most vulnerable refugees. This entails providing support to the development of the targeting methodology, the assistance package design, and the systems in place to support monitoring and evaluation – particularly in data management. All of these elements are necessary for an inter-agency programme of this magnitude.

In addition to the above, the sector will retain the following in-kind packages of assistance:

- NFIs to newcomers. However, this approach is currently under review and may switch to cash assistance in early 2015.
- Contingency stock to allow timely response to a potential influx or internal displacement.
