



Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	<b>840,171</b>

### Highlights

- On 02 September, AFAD, the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Turkey's Government, announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in the 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 220,705. AFAD reported that from 01 to 02 September, a total of 511 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 285 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- During the previous week, there were a group of 50 persons waiting at the gate of Karkamis camp in makeshift tents. As per UNHCR's recommendation to the camp management and local authorities, the group has been transferred to Viransehir camp, after which it was observed that two more families arrived. The camp management informed that they have also identified around 45 people who have been living as guests in the camp without registration. They will be sent to Viransehir together with the newly arrived 2 families.
- In Erzin town of Hatay, local officials informed that they have about 2,000 Syrians registered and living in town. The muhtars and SASF are providing assistance (food packages, clothing) depending on donations received from private donors and local community.
- In Kirikhan town of Hatay more than 24,500 Syrians have been registered by the police. Officials informed that when there are new arrivals to Kumlu town, they are also referred to Kirikhan for registration because the registration office was closed due to lack of new arrivals. In Kirikhan, a UNHCR team visited one of the Syrian community schools which has about 350 students between 1-9 grades. The school teachers informed that they are supported by faith-based NGOs; however this is not regular assistance. Reportedly there are two other schools also supported by faith-based NGOs where around 1700 children are so far registered with registration still on-going.
- In Viransehir, the school manager informed that the school will start by mid Sept. and in order to respond the increased number of camp population due to recent transfers from non-camp, thus increased number of children, they are going to put 30 additional tents (45 sqm each) near the school area to be used as classrooms.
