
In Syria (prior to displacement)

60% of men worked in manual labour in Syria. The majority of women (65%) supported the family at home. 7% of registered refugees were salaried professionals (business, medical, or engineering backgrounds, etc.) prior to the crisis.

In Lebanon

73%² of Syrian registered adults are not working (50% among men and 93% among women). On average, one member of the family, regardless of the household size, is responsible for supporting the entire family financially.






Average monthly income among those working

Average number of working members per household size




