## 2- Bi-weekly Updates from the field (13<sup>th</sup> January to 2<sup>nd</sup> February 2016)

### UNICEF

- UNICEF has signed a contract with UNOPS for monitoring of UNICEF activities in the camp including WASH activities. UNOPS team will observe the WASH activities and visit the WASH IPs & contractors to understand the WASH programme and then will come-up with their ideas how can UNOPS monitors can support WASH sector.
- SDC will be supporting drilling a new borehole along with connecting the J-stations. SDC team is visiting to the Azraq camp to see the proposed location of borehole. More details of the project will be provided in March 2016.

### ACTED

- ACTED continued cleaning the areas and the wash blocks at both markets. ACTED hired 4 additional IBVs for these purposes.
- Garbage amount has increased; for the first time 430 m3 had been collected in one day. The average of collected garbage during the last two weeks was 232 m3 comparing with 170 m3 before.

### Water supply:

- Water delivered – to J-stations: 6230 m3
- Water delivered – to off-network agencies: 825 m3
- Total Water delivered – 7055 m3 through 252 truck trips

- FRC samples taken – at J-stations: 70, avg. FRC level 0.8 ppm
- FRC samples taken – at borehole: 16, avg. FRC level 0.8 ppm
- FRC samples taken – at tap stands: 2, avg. FRC level 0.6 ppm
- Microbiological samples taken – at J-stations: 3. All negative
- Microbiological samples taken – at R.A, school, V3 & V6: 3. All negative

#### **Solid waste management & desludging:**

- Solid waste removed: 3250 m3
- Waste water removed – transferred external WWTP : 1797 m3
- Waste water removed – delivered to internal WWTP: 353 m<sup>3</sup>
- Total Waste water collected and disposed: 2150 m3

#### **ACF**

- KAP survey Data analysis is done, an initial result report is shared with UNICEF for revision and validation, then it will be shared with other partners
- WASH MONITORING: Round three of WASH monitoring is completed, all data has been submitted to UNICEF, and round four will start on Thursday.
- 14 Call are received through hotline number which are addressed.
- Cleaning kits handed over from ACTED is completed. In next few days, 2 plots will be selected where grey water pilot project will be executed.
- There is a visit scheduled for potential contractors for construction of four additional tap stands.
- 29 taps are replaced/repared during last two weeks along with the maintenance of 401 super structure of WASH blocks.
