	iii) Gender & Masculinities: Suhail Abualsameed provided a brief update about the key activities undertaken by UNHCR with regard to engaging men and boys in preventing and responding to SGBV. A total of 70 beneficiaries were reached through specific orientation sessions conducted during the 16 days of Activism One session was tailored to engage members of Family Protection Department (FPD). The key distinctive element of the session was sharing gender-biased examples from the local culture that helped participants to better relate the findings with their own circumstances and culture. The following observations were made: i) Coordination: Achievements: ✓ Effective engagement of men and boys in the 16 days of activism campaign. ✓ More efficient disaggregation of SGBV indicators in the Activity info. ✓ Training plans for the capacity building of the SGBV-SWG members shared regularly. Gaps: ✓ Representation of the government at the SGBV-SWG. ✓ Strengthen the SGBV-SWG at the field level and closer coordination of the SGBV-SWG with the Working Groups in the camps	2016 to be conducted in the	All members

Achievements:

- ✓ Engaging men and boys in SGBV activities especially in 16 days of Activism
- ✓ Gender Focal Points are also member of the SGBV SWG and they mainstream gender in different sectors.
- ✓ Regular trainings on prevention to service providers
- ✓ Trainings on SGBV in relation with disabilities specifically intellectual disabilities and LGBTI rights and programme approaches.

Gaps:

✓ Safety audits to be conducted more regularly in camps and urban settings

- ✓ SGBV-SWG effective advocacy with regard to the refugee rights in the Informal Tent Settlements (including training police officers)

- ✓ Comprehensive Case Management training
- ✓ Safe shelters facilities improved and training provided to DWU, MOSD;
