Field update	<p>Zaatari</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The ESWG/CP code of conduct has been completed. This will be translated into Arabic and shared with members.• IRC plans to conduct a training on child protection for 100 partners and volunteers at the end of March (a date will be communicated).• IMC has identified 50 cases of violence in schools. However, the parents of these children do not intend to pursue the cases with the schools.• CP work plan is almost completed.• There are ongoing discussions to merge SGBV and CP SWGs in Zaatari. If this is agreed upon elections will be conducted for new co-chairs.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- CP members should nominate their staff and volunteers to attend the training.- The 50 cases will be shared with SCJ who will conduct awareness raising for the parents.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- All CP members- IMC/SCJ

	<p>EJC</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The number of refugees is increasing at the camp. At the moment there are 5,200 refugees at this location. • There are new cases of Scabies and Hepatitis C reported. This has made some parents stop taking their children to school. UNICEF has been informed of this. • On March 05, there will be an orientation for partners on the SGBV/CP SOPs and referral pathways. • FPD, UNHCR and CP partners will have a meeting where FPD will share their mandate and what they are doing on CP and SGBV issues. The same will take place in Azraq and other field locations. <p>Azraq</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The number of refugees is also increasing. There might be a need for expansion of the camp. • At the reception area there are 32 separated children who have been captured by Police around the country. <p>Host communities</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • UNICEF is expanding their CFSs through ICSC. They have identified 15 more centers (from 20-35).

The signing and endorsement will be completed by mid-March. • Next, the TF will work on the BID SOPs and thereafter the group will be dissolved.
