Between September and November 2014, a Safety Audit was conducted in Zaatari refugee camp. As general finding, the safety audit indicates that refugees in Zaatari camp feel safer than in 2013, when first Safety Audit was conducted. . - The specific SGBV safety audit recommendations include: increase inclusion of people with disability and other people with specific needs and engaging men and boys in SGBV prevention and response.
